Latest Developments:

Yarmouk camp was hit by a number of massive rockets on Monday, targeting "Alkrain" group and causing damages that were limited to their material. Clashes erupted between "Alkrain" group and the Syrian security forces and factions loyal to them, using light and medium weapons.



The Action Group's correspondent provided that ISIS militants had prevented children from leaving Yarmouk camp, especially females, to celebrate Eid al-Adha in the nearby areas of Yilda, Babil and Beit Sahm.

Residents of Yarmouk camp are still complaining of the abuses and repressive practices carried out by ISIS towards them. They are also suffering from the continued siege imposed on the camp and the disastrous humanitarian situation that almost 3000 people are living.

In Aleppo, a number of volunteers and staff of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA), launched a clean-up campaign, on Monday. Piles of accumulated

rubbish lying on the outskirts of Neirab camp were lifted, in order to maintain a healthy environment for the people and prevent the spread of diseases and harmful insects. The cleaning process included moving the garbage on the streets and boxes to dumps, as well as removing the accumulated dust from the roads.

Residents of the Neirab camp had previously complained about the spread of harmful insects, rodents and nasty smells. This was caused by the farmers' use of fertilized water to irrigate their neighboring land, threatening to create environmental damage and health hazards to those living in that area.



They also warned of the spread of the (Aleppo grain) disease, leishmaniasis, or the so-called "sand fly" which is one of the serious illnesses expanding in Aleppo.

As part of the school bag project, Afaq Educational Center cooperated with the Relief Foundation for Palestinian people and the Islamic Relief across the world, to distribute approximately 118 school bags at the beginning of the new school year 2017-2018. Nursery and primary school, Palestinian-Syrian students in the

Wadi al-Zayneh region in the province of Kharoub in Lebanon, were given the bags.

Palestinians of Syria: September 5, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the working group is 3571, including 462 women
- 1633 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 103 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,511 days in a row
- 198 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1248 days, and 1089 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,584 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 337 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
