Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Bombardment targets Deraa camp and areas inhibited by Palestinian families south of Syria"

- Member of Free Palestine Movement killed in Deir ez-Zor
- Syrian security prevents Palestinian Yarmouk camp residents from exiting through Al-Qadam barrier
- 85 Palestinian cases of summary executions since the beginning of war in Syria
- "Doctors of the World" association: Most refugees in Greece have no medical care



Victims

The military wing of the Free Palestine Movement announced the death of "Ismaeil Hussien Zidane," member of its Al-Aqsa Shield Forces, while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces in Deir ez-Zor city, east Syria.

AGPS has documented the death of 623 Palestinian refugees as a result of fighting alongside the Syrian regime.



Latest Developments

The Syrian regime forces violently bombarded Deraa camp, Deraa towns and Al-Mansheya neighborhood, homes to dozens of Palestinian families, with heavy-caliber mortars and tanks, on Wednesday, leading to material damage.





This came amid the continuous breakout of clashes between the Syrian regime forces and its affiliated armed groups and the armed opposition forces.

The past few days have seen violent clashes between the Syrian regime forces and the opposition in Al-Mansheya neighborhood, since a cease-fire was declared in the southern region of Syria on July 9th.

Meanwhile, AGPS's correspondent in south Damascus confirmed that the Syrian security made a decision during the "reconciliation committee" meeting in Al-Qadam, to ban the exit of Palestinian refugees from Yarmouk camp through Al-Qadam barrier in the capital Damascus.

Our correspondent quoted a member of the reconciliation committee that said: "The decision was made in the presence of the director of the Political Department of the Palestine Liberation Organization, Anwar Abdul-Hadi, to limit their exit through the checkpoint of Babilla town in south Damascus, supervised by the Palestine Branch.

The Al-Qadam Assaly barrier, supervised by the area's branch, affiliated to the Syrian security, did not mind the passing of Palestinians, only if the reconciliation committee in Al-Qadam approved.

Our reporter covered the camp's residents' criticism and resentment because of the suffocating decision. Activists accused the Syrian regime of practicing a racist policy against the Palestinian refugees,



where others are allowed to go out for treatment in the capital's hospitals or to enter and exit the towns of southern Damascus.

A number of diseases are spreading vigorously among children and the elderly due to the siege in Yarmouk camp and the prevention of Palestinians from leaving south Damascus.

In another context, AGPS revealed that 85 Palestinian refugees died in summary executions since the beginning of the Syrian conflict and until 5th of October 2017.

AGPS's Monitoring and Documentation team explained that out of those executed, 17 were enlisted in the ranks of the Palestine Liberation Army. They were kidnapped in mid-2012 as they were returning from their location in Masyaf to Neirab camp in Aleppo, before being liquidated a month after their abduction.

The Action Group confirmed that the victims who were executed were distributed among the Palestinian camps and Syrian cities as follows: 19 refugees in Deraa camp, 18 in Aleppo, 16 in Yarmouk camp, 7 in Al-Tadamon neighborhood in the Damascus suburb, 5 in Al-Husseiniya camp, 2 in Al-Sayeda Zeinab, one refugee in Al-Aedin camp in Hama and another in Khan Al-Sheih camp.

In another context, "Doctors of the World" humanitarian association said that the migrated refugees in Greece do not receive medical care, for most of the health conditions they are dealing with.

In a statement made by the association on Tuesday, 72% of the health conditions the refugees are suffering from are not being treated correctly, or treated at all.



Women are not seeking medical care for not knowing their rights, or believing that the health system is too complicated, or fearing detention and discrimination.

The number of trapped Palestinian-Syrians in Greece is 400 refugees, most of which are located on the islands of Lesbos, Mytilene, Chios, Leros and Kos. Among them are families, children, women and the elderly. They are distributed among refugee camps, some of them living in tents and others in large halls. Most of the refugees came from Yarmouk, Deraa, Al-Aedin and Al-Husseiniya camps in Syria.



Palestinians of Syria: October 5, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3594, including 462 women
- 1639 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,541 days in a row



- 199 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1278 days, and 1118 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,614 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 365 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
