"For More Than Two Years; Thae Syrian Regime Continues Preventing People of Sheineh Camp From Returning Back To Their Homes"

RECENT UPDATES

Inhabitants of Al-Diabiyya and Sbiena camp appealed for reopening the roads to their homes similarly to Al-Husseiniya camp, and allowing the displaced people to return and build their war-ravaged houses, where the Regime's Army and some Palestinian militias continue preventing people from returning back to their homes for the day (748) after being forced to leave because of the violent clashes between the army and opposition groups, which ended with the Regime's Army winning the camp completely and expelling all the inhabitants out.

According to eyewitness' estimates; more than 80% of Sheineh camp buildings are destroyed, especially, the area from Mouaz Bin Jabal mosque to the main bakery of the camp or Kurds' Bakery, which forms the western entrance of the camp.

Aldiabiyya also, which was inhabited by hundreds of Palestinian families was bombed by the Syrian Regime's forces and robbed as well.



The inhabitants of these places have fled to the nearby towns and camps, this displacement brought them into a new suffering exceeded leaving

homes to affect all aspects of their lives, their lives turned into a tragedy because of the economic conditions and widespread unemployment and weak financial resources. Hundreds of them live in schools as evacuation centers where several families could be crammed in one room, this situation pushed many of them to migrate.

In a different topic, the Syrian army targeted, yesterday, the road between Khan Eshieh camp and Zakya town with heavy weapons, during that, activists and some other people via social media warned of crossing that road.


Zakya - Khan Eshieh road considered to be the lifeline of the camp especially after closure of all other roads making it a compulsory passage in spite of the serious potential dangers. The "Death Road" as people of Khan Eshieh nicknamed it, is being targeted by the Regime's forces quite often.



The AGPS has documented death of (141) victims from Khan Eshieh refugees camp.

In the meantime, Syrian security forces arrested the Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Al-Derby" 38-year-old lives in Al-Nayrab camp in Aleppo.

The Military Security forces with the pro-regime militias broke into his home and took him to unknown destination without declaring the reasons behind this arrest.



The AGPS has documented the names of (84) prisoners from Al-Nayrab camp only, and (1014) Palestinian prisoners in general.

Moving to Turkey, the Palestinian Syrian refugees who fled the war in Syria to Turkey are suffering from many difficulties and challenges led them into very hard living conditions, these difficulties are represented in the lack of job opportunities and the challenge of learning the Turkish language added to the high competition in job market since hundreds of thousands of displaced refugees are seeking jobs too. Moreover, some employers exploit their refugees' workers for more working hours and low wages in return, while others put prerequisite to obtain residence permit.

Many of displaced families in Turkey live in storages or joint flats or even tents sometimes. A Palestinian refugee says: "the worst house rent could be 150 USD, without counting the bills, which is more than expensive to me".


It is noteworthy that most of the Palestinian Syrian refugees in Turkey are originally from Yarmouk and Handarat and Al-Nayrab and Daraa camps which had been affected by the military strikes. Those refugees managed to reach the Turkish lands through Idlib and Halab Provinces, from which they passed to Hatay and Gaziantep Provinces in Turkey.

It is noteworthy that Turkey, mostly, is not the final destination for the Palestinian Syrians, but serves as the most prominent transit point to Europe, as it is one of the most important paths from which the refugees ride the sea boats toward Italy and other European countries. This comes as a result of closing all borders in front of the Palestinian refugees.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics until 5 December 2015

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFGC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 887 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 957 days, water cut for 447 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 748 days respectively.

- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 949 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Water cut continues for 593 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Homs and Aedein Hamma: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
