Detainees

Social media pages shared news about the Syrian security forces that arrest "Amal Asfour," an activist at n the Palestinian national body of the PLO, while the AGPS could not assure the news from other resources.

The number of Palestinian detainees in Syrian prisons since the beginning of war events in Syria has reached 918 detainees, according to the AGPS statistics, as well as it documented the names of 404 Palestinian victims who died due to torture in Syrian prisons.

The Palestinian refugee Hussein Nejem from Khan AL Shieh camp died due to the shelling at Al Sakeik Street adjacent to the camp.

Meanwhile, the young man Mahmoud Zuhair Swailem from Yarmouk camp, and who resides at Rokn Al Dein compound, also died due to wounds he attained by a mortar shell that targeted Baghdad Street at the Syrian capital of Damascus.


Recent Updates

A number of rockets and missiles targeted Loubia and Yarmouk Streets in the Yarmouk camp south of the Syrian capital Damascus yesterday, which burn a house and resulted in only material damages.

The shelling coincided with clashes that broke out in the vicinity of Rija Square between Palestinian armed groups and ISIS alongside Al Nusra Front, where ISIS is still imposing its control over about 60% of neighborhoods and lanes of Yarmouk camp.

In a related context, violent shelling targeted the vicinity of Khan Al Shieh camp at Al Sakeik neighborhood, which resulted in the death of three young men; they are:

The Palestinian refugee Hussein Nejem, the young man Tamer al-Shara, and the young man Hisham Abu Rami; they are all Syrians.

It is worth mentioning that the vicinity of Khan Al Shieh, the farms, and the adjacent areas are witnessing acts of shelling and clashes almost daily between the regular army and groups of the Syrian armed opposition.

Meanwhile, all roads linking the camp and the capital Damascus are still closed except "Zakia- Khan Al Shieh," where people were forced to go through it in spite of the risks they may face after repeated shelling and targeting.

Turning to the north of Syria, the checkpoints of the Syrian Regime army are still stationed along the road to Turkey that tighten security procedures against Palestinian Syrian refugees who fled the war, and who are forced to go through land border because of the Turkish authorities to stop Palestinian Syrian entry visas of its territory.

According to activists, refugees are forced to pay large sums of money to the regime's checkpoints in order to allow them to cross, where those amounts ranging between "50,000" Syrian pounds per person, and about "175,000" Syrian pounds per family.

On the other side of the Syrian-Turkish border, the Turkish authorities are significantly tighten security procedures on its borders, forcing the

refugees to stay overnight in the open for a day or two so that they illegally enter.

Turkish authorities prevent the entry of Palestinian Syrian refugees into their territory systematically, which forced refugees to pay about "20,000" pounds for brokers and smugglers in border areas in order to facilitate their entry into the Turkish territory.

It is worth mentioning that activists confirmed to the AGPS the injury of a Palestinian Syrian refugee - unnamed for private reasons- as he was shot while trying to enter Turkish territory last week and was taken to a hospital in the Turkish city of Rihaniyya.

On the other hand, the Palestinian female student "Nada Khalid Shawaheen" from the Yarmouk refugee camp accomplished the first rank in the Syrian high school exams.

Meanwhile, the two students YAman Mwafaq Atwa and Mohammed Alaa Al Dein Jalbout have got the fourth rank.

This was days after the high school results announcement in Lebanon, where Palestinian Syrian students achieved high rates in spite of the harsh conditions they went through.

Lebanon

260 Palestinian Syrian families fled the hell of war in Syria searching safer haven, so they fled to Lebanon and inhabited in Rashidiyeh Palestinian refugee camp in southern Lebanon.

Yet, the tragedy has re-emerged again as a result of the deteriorating security situation and the clashes that broke out in the camp, which resulted in the death of one victim and a number of wounded, in addition to what is caused by misuse of weapons in the camp of panic among the residents.

A number of Palestinian refugee camps in Lebanon are experiencing a state of security chaos and instability, prompting the national and Islamic Palestinian factions to form a security force to put an end to the security chaos between now and then, and in order to impose security by force in those camps, to reveal everyone who disobey security and to control them as a kind of mercy the people of the camp and the displaced from Syria."

In this context, some activists accused what they called a "suspicious bodies working to blow up the situation in the Palestinian camps in Lebanon from time to time according to outside agendas, to conduct the people of the camps to internal fighting and push them toward the blast accused as if there is a plan behind it to push things in that direction."

Numbers and Statistics till 5/7/2015

- 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 738 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 808 days, water was cut for 298 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 619 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 600 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 802 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 445 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
