





Female Detainees

The AGPS documentation team announced that the number of Palestinian female detainees in the prisons of the Syrian regime since the beginning of the ongoing war in Syria till the moment of preparing this report has reached (52) Palestinian female refugees.

The female detainees included 15 from Damascus suburb, 13 from Damascus, 4from Homs, and 20 from different areas in Syria, while the AGPS documented the names of 37 Palestinian female refugees were lost inside Syrian territory and abroad.

The AGPS confirmed that there are female detainees in each Palestinian camp in Syria; most of them were arrested at checkpoints on gates and entrances of the camps and cities. The documentation team reported that: "Some detainees are University students or activists; on January 6, 2013, the Architecture student "S-A" was arrested by members of the checkpoint at the entrance of Yarmouk, while the other student "S-A" was also arrested on Augustus 9,2013, from the University campus in the city of Homs, where she was arrested for about two weeks.

Syrian security services arrested three female refugees from Al Aedein camp in Homs while trying to break into the house of Al Sayed family, where militants are hiding, in order to pressure, and push them to surrender, despite the wanted refugees surrender in exchange for not hurting their families and to release female detainees.

Evidence suggests that the number of female detainees to the conflict parties is greater than this number, but it is secrecy for special reasons related to those cases.

It was mentioned that Palestinian women in Syria had been arrested, kidnapped, killed, and being disability, as a result of the ongoing conflict in Syria since the outbreak of fighting there in March 2011 between the Syrian crisis parties.

Recent Updates

Residents of Al Aedein camp in Homs suffer of difficulties and obstacles in communication with their relatives after that the Syrian security set up an iron fence separates neighborhoods of the camp in Homs and the western side of the university campus and housing, and neighborhoods of Al Waleed, Ikrema, Wadi Al Thahabin the eastern region, starting from Al Sham road-Tadmor crossing till Al Timthal crossing at the bridge conjunction and Hadara Street without any service corridors between the two sides.

Residents became forced to go through the south across Tadmor crossing in order to return to Al Sham Road, which doubled transport costs

especially on students and employees, and residents who have a review with UNRWA clinic and Bisan hospital.

The iron fence negatively impacted on shopkeepers in the eastern neighborhoods because they have lost all their clients from the western side.

In terms of the reasons of building such fence, our correspondent noted that the security reason is to ensure the protection of neighborhoods of the pro-regime eastern region.

In addition, our correspondent in Aleppo reported news about the injury of the Palestinian refugee "Ibrahim Cetane" From Nairab camp with shell shrapnel that was dropped on Alsabeel area in Aleppo, and was taken for treatment in the hospital of the city, while residents of Neirab still complain of continued power cut for long hours, which doubled their suffering in light of the significant high temperatures in the Middle East.

Detainees

Syrian security forces arrested the Palestinian refugee "Walid Zakaria Khalil al-Halabi" from Al Aedein camp in Homs on August 4, from his place of work in the Hasyaa area; he is in his thirties, originally from Acre city in Palestine.

The number of Palestinian detainees in Syrian prisons since the beginning of war events in Syria has reached 933 detainees, according to the AGPS statistics, while it documented the names of 408 Palestinian victims who died due to torture in Syrian prisons.

Release

Syrian security forces released the 22-year-Palestinian refugee "Ahmad Ziad Mareita" from Muzeireeb compound southern Syria after being arrested for almost four months.

In addition, the refugee "Firas Haj Yahia," in his forties, originally from the city of Safed in Palestine, was also released on August 1, from Adra prison in Damascus suburb after being arrested for more than four months.

Lebanon

Directorate General of Lebanese Public Security called all Palestinian Syrian and Syrian refugees to regularize their legal status at border crossing points and to pay fees imposed on them.



A statement was issued by the Directorate General of Public Security on its website said: "The General Directorate of General Security informs all Syrian and Palestinian Syrian refugees of Syria, who entered to Lebanon before 05.01.2015 and their residency exceeded the legal period granted to them for up to four years from the date of entering the Lebanese territory and wishing to leave, to exclusively apply in departments and border centers for regularizing their conditions and pay ignored fees.





Noting that the Lebanese General Security was asking departing to regularize their situation at the General Directorate of General Security in Beirut and get a leave in 48 hours before the day of travel.

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria

The AGPS issued the English version of the report "Yarmouk Camp, the Full Truth" this morning.

This research monitors the most important events suffered by the Yarmouk refugee camp, for being the largest Palestinian refugee camp, from March 2011 till the end of May 2015 through three main sections which dealt with the evolution of the Yarmouk crisis through two major phases. The first phase is before 16th of December 2012; the date of targeting the camp with 'MIG' warplanes and the second phase is post-December 17, 2012; the date of the Yarmouk population displacement.

In addition, the research highlighted the Yarmouk refugee camp in terms of location, foundation, and strategic importance for Damascus and its suburbs, as well as the numbers of victims of the Yarmouk refugee camp since the beginning of events in Syria until the end of last May. The research addressed the beginnings of forming civil committees for the Defense of Yarmouk camp, which was between rejection and acceptance by residents and some Palestinian factions, and explained how armed battalions entered Yarmouk.

The 60-page-report talked about total and partial siege imposed on the Yarmouk camp by the regular army and the Palestinian factions, and its implications and negative effects on the camp's residents, where it focused on the initiatives of lifting the Yarmouk siege.

The report allocated a special section for ISIS control over Yarmouk, causes, motives, and results, and the accompanied violations, and international, regional, and Palestinian.responses.

In conclusion, the report came out with several conclusions and recommendations; the most important is: lifting the siege, return of residents, and providing protection to refugees as stipulated in international conventions and the Universal Charter of Human Rights.

It is noteworthy that this search was based on field reports that were documented by the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria through its correspondents' network in the Palestinian camps and compounds.

Numbers and Statistics till 5/8/2015

- 15,500Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 764 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 834 days, water was cut for 324 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 645 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 626 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 827 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 471 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
