VICTIMS

A Palestinian guy "Mohamed Mansour Shafie" announced dead after he was arrested by security forces which control the check point of Conferences Palace in Damascus. He was with his brother, who is still missing, while they were on their way to funeral and bury their sister in the cemetery of Hosseinieh. Mohamed, from Hosseinieh camp, is the 430th Palestinian tortured to death documented by AGPS.

RECENT UPDATES

Palestinian Activists have launched a social media campaign Facebook and *Twitter* solidarity with residents of besieged town of Madaya. The town is under horrific siege imposed by Assad regime and Hezbollah militias. According to activists, the campaign started on Wednesday 6th January using the Arabic hashtag



#اليرموك which means: Madaya is the sister of Yarmouk Camp.

The International media and human rights organizations said at least 23 people from Madaya starved to death last month. The sources added that most of the victims are children, infants and elderly people. It is mentioned that the sharp lack of milk and basic medicine is the main reason of the infants' death.

Last year, AGPS documented 184 Palestinian as victims of starvation in the ongoing siege of Yarmouk camp due to the tight control by Syrian security and Palestinian forces of PFLP-GC on the camp since 918 day.

In the same context, Jafra charity distributed medical aid to displaced Palestinian families who fled Yarmouk camp to the town of Yalda. Yarmouk camp is still suffering from the siege, particularly, after ISIS groups overrun the camp last April.



Outside Syria, cash assistance has been provided by the committee of Palestinians of Turkey to some destitute Palestinian families in Antakya south Turkey. According to the committee, about 90 families registered in

Antakya. The number of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Turkey estimated, unofficially, at 6000-8000 in Istanbul, mid and south of Turkey, the report issued by AGPS said last August.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 5 January 2016

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 918 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 988 days, water cut for 478 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 779 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 980 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 624 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Aedein Hama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia Khan EShieh road.
