Latest Developments

A Palestinian refugee identified as Rand Al-Khalidi, a resident of Khan Al-Sheih Camp, was kidnapped at a government checkpoint in Jdeidat Artouz town, in Damascus Suburbs.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 81 Palestinian women in Syrian government lock-ups over the past six years.



Meanwhile, violent clashes between ISIS militias and Fatah Al-Sham battalion rocked the blockaded Yarmouk Camp a couple of days ago. A deadly exchange of sniper bullets occurred all the way through the clashes.

Speaking with AGPS, local sources said a Fatah Al-Sham fighter disguised in a female dress crept into the ISIS-run Road 15 and unleashed barrages of deadly bullet fire at ISIS fighters deployed at a local checkpoint, triggering panic among civilians, particularly those blockaded in Fatah Al-Sham-led zones.

Yarmouk Camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime troops and the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine-General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,297 days running.



In a related development, Palestinians sheltered in Deraa Camp, Al-Muzeireeb, Gileen, and Tel Shehab have been grappling with deteriorating health conditions due to the unabated warfare rocking the Syrian territory for over five years.

Under-equipped hospitals and the absence of apt medical staff, coupled with an acute shortage in life-saving medicines and the lack of ambulances to evacuate the wounded civilians, have made the situation far worse in opposition-led areas in southern Syria.

Activists warned of the propagation of lethal infections and diseases among Deraa residents, who have been forced to drink contaminated water as water supplies to the camp have been cut off for 1,000 days.

Activists attributed the tragic situation in southern Syria to the tough cordon imposed by the government army on the area and the incessant

onslaughts on local hospitals, along with the forcible displacement or death of medical staff members.

Bloody hostilities between ISIS militias and the opposition outfits have made the situation far worse.

The condition has also gone downhill as the Jordanian authorities prevented the Palestinian refugees from entering Jordan for urgent treatment.

Civil Action Commissions

The Palestine Charity Commission, in cooperation with the Sahabat Syria Foundation, handed out food aids to 100 displaced families sheltered in makeshift tents in Al-Muzeireeb, Al-Fawar, and Al-Ajami areas.



Frequent power and water blackouts in Deraa have made life unbearable in the area.

Nearly 70% of civilian buildings in the camp have been reduced to rubble, forcing civilians to seek refuge in Al-Muzeireeb town and other southern Syrian villages.

Palestinians of Syria: January 6, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,416 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,138 Palestinian refugees, including 81 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,297 days in a row.
- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,001 and 815 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,343 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 79 days.
- Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,150 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians are taking refuge in Jordan.

- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
