Victims

The Palestinian young man, Mohammed Shihada Hayash, known as Abu Fadi Alzaanoun, died due to wounds he attained while fighting between the Regular Army and the armed opposition groups at Hesreen area in the eastern Ghouts. He is from the Yarmouk camp-Almagharba lane.



Recent Updates

The Syrian armed opposition factions operating in Khan Al Shieh compound issued a statement announcing the absence of any headquarters inside Khan Al Shieh camp. The AGPS received a copy of the statement which confirmed that the Syrian opposition factions committed to neutralizing civilians from all sides of fighting between them and the Syrian regime.

Those factions pledged to the people of Khan Al Shieh camp to maintain the safety and security by not appearing armed inside the camp, and they will not enter the military cars to the camp.

It is noteworthy that people of Khan Al Shieh camp in the western Ghouta of the capital Damascus, stressed the need to neutralize the camp for the ongoing conflict in Syria, and stressed that the camp, which houses about 12 thousand people, as well as hundreds of displaced people fleeing from the towns and cities of western Ghouta, such as Muadamiyat al-Sham, and Daria because of the deteriorating security situation there, is free of any military presence or appearances.



In the south of Damascus, residents of Ain Ghazal district and areas under the control of Fatah Alsham front - Nusra earlier in the Yarmouk refugee camp, warned from a new siege imposed by ISIS, which will reflect negatively on the already deteriorating living conditions.

The demanded to intervene to prevent the closure of roads toward their homes and neighborhoods controlled by Nusra, as ISIS demanded residents of those areas to leave their homes for a specific deadline and will close any port towards the mentioned areas, as well as they will target and snip any moving objects.

In the meantime, news reported that ISIS members seized the UNRWA's registration office by force, and they supervised the registration process for those who are affiliated with ISIS. They also registered their relatives by force of arms within the records of the Office, which distributes food parcels in the neighboring towns of Yalda, Babbila, and Beit Sahem.



ISIS prevented the besieged people in other areas within the camp of entering food and daily needs, and accused Nusra of what happens in the besieged areas. They also called for people to go to them and ask them to get out in order solving the problem, which provoked the residents who likened ISIS behavior to the actions of the Syrian regime and the affiliated factions such as GC.

In southern Syria, the Syrian Security released two Palestinian refugees from Muzeireeb town; they are: Bassam Khaled Abu Shella after being detained for more than a month and a half, and Amjad Kamel Kharroubi after being detained for about a month ago.

The AGPS documented 21 Palestinian detainees from Muzeireeb compound in Deraa in the prisons of the Syrian regime, including a woman, and they are still unaccounted for.

Muzeireeb town southern of Deraa includes a compound for the Palestinian refugees who are estimated with 8,500 refugees, in addition to a number of families who were displaced from Deraa camp.

Syrian security forces in Homs arrested four Palestinian refugees from Al Aedein camp and released another refugee, where Ayman Khattab "Abu Mohammed" was arrested on 17.07.2016. According to the AGPS correspondent, Khattab is a former officer in the Preventive Security Council of the Palestinian Authority, and he was arrested for the second time, as he was led to the main checkpoint of the camp's entrance near the eastern district (Damascus road), noting that he is in the beginning of sixties, and originally from Ein Alzaytoun village in Palestine.

On 24/07/2016, the refugees Mohammed Ziad Ayoub, known as Abu Ziad, in his forties, and originally from Al Jish village in Palestine, was arrested while in the Immigration Headquarters in Homs, and the refugee Ahmed Mahmoud Abu Orabi, in his thirties, and originally from Sabbarin village in Palestine, was also arrested at the University checkpoint.

Syrian security forces also arrested the Palestinian refugee Mahdi Mahmoud Taha on 08.02.2016, after he was led to Internet cafe in the camp to perform electrical maintenance, where he was arrested by members of the military forces who were waiting for him inside the shop. Mehdi Mahmoud Taha is one of the works in the Electricity emergency Office in the camp; he is in his thirties, and originally from the village of Ein Elzaytoun in Palestine.

Syrian security released the young man, "Ibrahim Adel Kayed," on 04.07.2016 after he was detained for more than fifty days; he is in his thirties, and originally from Alsefsaf village in Palestine.

Palestine Charity Committee continues to fill in water for Palestinian refugees displaced to Yalda and Babbila areas according to those in charge of the Committee that about 6,339 families have benefited from the services since the beginning of this year till the end of last June, in order to alleviate their suffering and to preserve their lives.

It is noteworthy that hundreds of Palestinian families had been displaced from the Yarmouk refugee camp following the storming of ISIS on early April 2015.

Turning to Lebanon, within the program of "My Project Initiative," Thabit organization for the right of return, in cooperation with AKCT for Consulting and training, implemented a course titled as "had the keys to success in life," targeting youth category of Palestinian Syrian and Lebanese refugees, on Thursday 18 Aug. at Hall Park Hotel - Chtaura / Beqaa.

The Initiative that was launched by Thabit organization for the right of return in cooperation with the Kuwaiti Arab Company for Consulting and Training for nearly three and a half months ago in the Palestinian refugee camps in Tire area, is a popular initiative that seeks to empower Palestinian youth with the practical skills and knowledge to enter the labor market.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 6\08\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1145 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1206 days, water was cut for 695 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 998 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 190 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 851 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
