

Victims

The pro-government Filasteen AlHurra battalion mourned the death of two fighters—Ahmed Omar AlHelou and Mohamed Majed Aboud. Both were killed in bloody hostilities between the Syrian regime and the opposition outfits in Harasta region, in Rif Dimashq.

At the same time, the Palestinian refugee Amjad Ragheb Nassar died under torture in Syrian government penitentiaries, his family has said.

The casualty was kidnapped five years earlier from the main entrance to Yarmouk Camp.

AGPS documented the death of 468 Palestinian refugees under torture in Syrian lock-ups.



Latest Developments

AGPS kept record of the death of 19 Palestinian refugees in July 2017, 16 among whom were fatally gunned down while another refugee died under



shelling. Blasts took away the life of one refugee. Another Palestinian drowned at sea.

As for the geographical distribution of the casualties, Rif Dimashq topped the list with 10 victims, followed by three in Hama, one in Daraa one in AlRiqa and another in Aleppo. A Palestinian also died in Damascus while two more others died in unknown locations.



In another development, ISIS struck on Sunday Tahrir AlSham-led zones in Haifa Street, in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, with mortar shells, resulting in heavy material damage.

Fierce clashes also burst out between ISIS and Tahrir AlSham in the area.

In Pictures circulated on Facebook, ISIS gunmen appear as flogging a Yarmouk resident on claims that he committed a religious felony. Another snapshot showed two ISIS militants as yelling at a Palestinian youth for shaving his beard.

In the meantime, ISIS has closed a number of local shops under the pretext that their owners did not pay mandatory alms-giving cash.

As of July 22, ISIS militias embarked on a campaign to force shopkeepers and street vendors to pay alleged alms-giving sums.



ISIS militias have stepped up crackdowns on civilians stranded in Yarmouk Camp. Over recent day ISIS ordered at least four families in AlShuhadaa zone to leave their homes. The targeted families are not allowed to take any of their personal belongings out of the camp.

The escalation has come shortly after reports have emerged on a new round of talks with pro-government parties, believed to be from Hezbollah.

Palestinians of Syria: August 06, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,552 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,622 Palestinian refugees, including 102 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.

- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,472 days in a row.
- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,211 and 1,060 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,554 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 307 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
