#### Latest Developments

Financial consultant at the Palestinian Red Crescent crew in Syria, Mohamed Youssef AlZu'bi, was pronounced dead just three days after he was released from a Syrian government lock-up, informed sources told AGPS.

According to the same sources, AlZu'bi was arrested some 20 days earlier.

AGPS kept record of the death of 459 Palestinian refugees under torture in Syrian regime penal complexes.



Meanwhile, Palestinian resident of Aleppo-based AlNeirab Camp Mohamed Emad Moussa, died as he fought alongside the pro-government AlQuds Brigade in AlRashideen, west of Aleppo.

Around 500 fighters, out of a total of 3,500 conscripts enlisted at the non-Palestinian Liwa AlQuds Brigade, have been identified as Palestinians who previously sought refuge in such shelters as AlNeirab, Handarat, and AlRaml. Fighters from Aleppo city and its northern and western

suburbs, along with so-called Shabah AlAswad combatants, have also been fighting alongside the AlNeirab-headquarted AlQuds battalion.



In another development, a report issued by AGPS under the title "The Wasted Lives" documented the violations endured by Palestinian women in war-tattered Syria since the outburst of the conflict in March 2011.

According to the report, which was issued on the eve of the International Women's Day, marked annually on March 8, Palestinian women have been subjected to abrupt searches and exhaustive questionings at military checkpoints.

Up to the moment of writing, AGPS kept account of the arrest of 94 Palestinian women sheltered in refugee camps across the embattled Syrian territories.

33 female detainees were released from Syrian lock-ups, four among whom freed as part of a swap deal struck between the regime army and the Free Syrian Army.

Meanwhile, 61 Palestinian girls and women have had mysterious fates in Syrian penitentiaries.

The report further raised alarm bells over such violations against women as arrest, abduction, execution, body disfigurement, sniper attacks, sexual abuse, enforced deportation, and denial of the right to a fair trial, among other violations that flagrantly breach international laws and treaties.

In the meantime, AGPS reporter said electricity is being gradually made back to normal in AlNeirab Camp, in Aleppo, following a one-year-and-a-half cut.

However, AlNeirab residents have been enduring abject socio-economic conditions due to high unemployment rates and the dramatic price hike.

#### Palestinians of Syria: March 8, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,456 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,173 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,356 days in a row.
- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.

- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,061 and 869 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,405 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 139 days.
- Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,210 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid-2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
