"People of Yarmouk Camp Sit-in to Demand Breaking the Siege and Entering the Drugs"

VICTIMS

The Palestinian refugee "Ibrahim Mohammed Muhammadiyah" 17-years-old, from Al-Nayrab camp was killed by Ahrar Al-Sham movement, one of the Syrian opposition factions. Muhammad had been kidnapped since last April during his return trip back from Turkey to Al-Nayrab camp by factions of Syrian opposition.



It should be noted that the number of Palestinian refugees who have died since the beginning of the conflict in Syria reached 3076 victims at least, according to statistics documented by the AGPS.

RECENT UPDATES

A number of civil society institutions in Yarmouk refugees camp south of Damascus organized a sit-in in front of the UNRWA office in Schools St. calling for lifting the siege imposed on the camp, and appealing to the UNRWA and the ICRC and medical and humanitarian organizations in the world to exert pressure on the Syrian regime to let the medicines and medical supplies in, due to the deteriorating health situation in the camp and the spread of many chronic diseases, typhoid and jaundice among Yarmouk residents.

It is noteworthy that of the rest of the people remained inside Yarmouk camp are suffering from a severe shortage of medical services because of

the continuing siege imposed by the regime's army and PFLP-GC, and because of the shelling that hits hospitals which led to major damages.

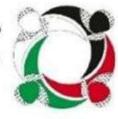


Moreover, since the beginning of last April; ISIS took control over the camp and forced most of the relief agencies out towards the nearby town of Yalda, and assassinated many activists.

It is noteworthy that 184 of the Yarmouk refugees died as a direct result of the siege because of the nutrition and medical care shortage.

In another context, Palestinian activists and residents of Al-Husayniyya camp demand to reveal the fate of their relatives inside the Syrian regime's prisons, and to take serious moves to release them, stressing on the importance of sending a delegation to make talks with the Syrian military security regarding those who were arrested because of similarity of names though that they had applied for return and got their approval prior to their arrest.

Activists have accused the Syrian regime forces located at the camp entrance's checkpoint of arresting more than 20 civilians including women and elderlies, such as "Abu Hisham Alqublaoa" 80-years-old who

was arrested while returning to his house in Husayniyya camp in Damascus Suburb.

Moreover, the checkpoint soldiers, on 26.08.2015, had prevented the family of "Owayyid Al-Hasan" from returning back to their home inside the camp, and arrested one of them, knowing that three other family members were tortured to death in the Syrian regime's prisons; Lieutenant Ahmed and Mohammed and Ayman on charges of desertion from the Palestine Liberation Army PLA.

It is worth mentioning that the Syrian army had reopened the camp again at 16 August 2015 and allowed some families to return to their homes.


MISSING

The Palestinian refugee "Maher Ahmad" born in 1978 from Khan Eshieh camp was lost since 2 December 2015 in Damascus while working on his pickup truck, without any information about his fate until the moment of writing this report.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS managed to document 281 cases of Palestinian Syrian refugees who were lost in Syria since the beginning of the war, but it is believed that the real number is much more than that.

LEBANON

Student Welfare Fund "Serat" announced sponsoring 19 students from the Palestinian Syrians in Lebanon. According to Serat's press release;

16 students are registered at the Lebanese University, and three students at the Faculty of Sharia.



It is noteworthy that the Student's Welfare Fund "Serat" was founded in the city of Sidon southern Lebanon in 2004 to ensure the dissemination of science and provide students aid to Palestinians, Lebanese and Arab students.

CIVIL WORK COMMITTEES

The women's department in the "Palestinian Syrians in Lebanon Committee" in cooperation with the Al-Shifaa Association completed, Yesterday, a first-aid course for women in Bekaa region in north of Lebanon, the course at which a number of Palestinian refugee women had participated, was held in order to explain the rules of and steps of first

aid procedures which anyone might need in everyday-life, also included lessons of how to deal with choking cases, shortness of breath, injuries and fractures.

It is noteworthy that the Committee had organized on 10.17.2015 a similar course which at the end of it, a Palestinian Syrian refugee was employed as an ambulance driver of Al-Shifaa association emergency point at Barilias region.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 8 December 2015

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 890 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 960 days, water cut for 450 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 751 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 952 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

- Dara'a Camp: Water cut continues for 596 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Homs and Aedein Hamma: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
