"Four Palestinians Die in Syria and the Syrian Opposition Publishes Photos Found in Idlib Prove the Regime's Involvement in the PLA Officers Massacre Two Years Ago"

Victims

The refugee "Rami Bassam Abu Ras" died after earlier clashes broke into Deir Yassin neighborhood behind the Palestine Hospital, and the elderly refugee woman "Fethiye Khalil Abu Jawied," was born in 1935 also died due to the lack of food and medical care in the Yarmouk Camp, bringing the number of siege victims to (175) victims.

The death of the two refugees brings the number of Palestinian victims who died in the Yarmouk refugee camp since the ISIS entry to Yarmouk to (22) victims.

The young man "Majid Mawas" died after Syrian warplanes targeted Daraa camp before yesterday and a house was completely destroyed, while the young men "Mohammed Ghayas," "Khalid Mawas," and "Ratib Al Bahari" were injured.

The pro-Syrian PFGC announced the death of one of its members, "Amjad Khattab" due to the ongoing clashes with ISIS at Yarmouk Camp Crossing.

Recent Updates of the Yarmouk Camp

At least 6 explosive barrels targeted different areas of the Yarmouk camp yesterday causing massive destruction of buildings and properties, while



the deteriorated conditions following the shelling prevented the announcement of any victims or injuries.

For his part, "Abu Hammam," a leader of Aknaf brigades announced through a video record was published yesterday that Aknaf is determined to continue confront ISIS attacks against the Yarmouk camp, confirming that he and Aknaf members are inside the Yarmouk camp.

Meanwhile, sporadic clashes continue between Aknaf brigades alongside with Youth groups and ISIS groups, where Aknaf members confronted ISIS groups at the vicinity of Loubey Street, as each party kept his controlled areas, where ISIS controls almost 80% of the camp.

Moreover, the humanitarian situation is continue to deteriorate, where all relief organizations stopped working for fear of its cadres to be kidnapped by ISIS, while the residents renewed their appeals to the international sides in order to enter medical supplies urgently to the camp, where dozens of wounded people are still without treatment.

On the other hand, media sources close to the Syrian regime reported that the PLO Central Committee member and the Palestinian presidential delegate to Syria "Ahmad Majdalani" said that "the Syrian government



and the Syrian leadership is responsible for all the Syrian territories, and from here, and the Syria's keenness to protect citizens, and the maintenance of security and stability, we put it today, in the hands of the Syrian government regarding the Yarmouk refugee camp, and we will support any decision to come out in this regard. "

The Syrian Minister of National Reconciliation "Ali Haidar" within a press conference at the headquarters of the Ministry of Reconciliation in Damascus commented that "the Syrian army is to start its military operations against militants in the Yarmouk refugee camp, where the current situation in the Yarmouk refugee camp calls for a military solution imposed by the government by the entry of insurgents".

On the other hand, the two relief organizations of Nour and Jafra distributed some relief aid to hundreds of families who were displaced from the Yarmouk camp to the nearby town of Yelda.

Interaction with the Yarmouk Camp

Solidarity sit-ins implemented in Deir Al Balah, Gaza and Al Rasheideya and Wadi Al Zeina towns in Lebanon. The protestors demanded all the Palestinian and international institutions and parties to take urgent action against in order to put an end to the suffering of the Yarmouk camp.

The Syrian opposition published photographs of the two PLA recruits bodies of, "Mahmoud Abu Al Leil" and "Anas KAreim" with signs of torture, where opposition groups have found those pictures among a group of pictures of torture victims that were found in the Criminal Security Branch (one of the Syrian security branches) in the city of Idlib, after it controlled it.

The published pictures showed the rooms and the means of torture by Syrian security forces, indicating the responsibility of the Syrian security forces in Idlib for the massacre in which seventeen PLA recruits were



killed after being kidnapped for nearly two years while they were on their way back from a military location in Masyaf to their camp Neirab in Aleppo before being assassinated after a month of being kidnapped.

The Syrian regime accused the Syrian armed opposition groups of assassinating the victims. the Syrian security forces and members loyal to it promoting it and mobilized the people of Neirab to fight the Syrian opposition, in conjunction with the formation of al-Quds Brigade military group in order to fight alongside the Syrian army in the war against the Syrian opposition.

Der'aa Camp

Two explosive barrels were dropped by the Syrian warplanes at Al Muzaireib town in Der'aa Governorate causing a mass destruction to the houses and no news about injuries. It is mentioned that the town contains a compound for almost 8500 Palestinian Refugees who are living in a difficult humanitarian conditions.

In addition, the Syrian warplanes also dropped one explosive barrel over Der'aacamp and no news about injuries, a day after the bombing of the camp, which led to the death of a resident and three wounded after the full destruction of a building.

It is mentioned that about 70% of the buildings of the camp were destroyed, as the AGPS documented the names of 41 victims from Al Muzeireeb compound died since the beginning of the war in Syria, as well as the names of 203 victims from Der'aa camp.



Lebanon

UNRWA announced that it will implement regional standards for food aid in Lebanon starting from April 2015. It clarified that every displaced Palestinian from Syria in Lebanon and who is qualified for this aid will grant 40.00 LP.

This procedure came as a result of the difficult living conditions lived by the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon as they complain of stressful economic crises as a result of widespread of unemployment among them and the lack of a steady income, in addition to their unstable legal status in Lebanon due to the laws established by the Lebanese authorities.

It is worth mentioning that UNRWA suspended its cash aid to 1100 Palestinian Syrian families since October 2014.

Numbers and Statistics till 8/4/2015

- *At least **27933** Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **641** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **721** days, water was cut for **211** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to **175** victims.*
- ***80,000** Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including **10,687** refugees in Jordan, **51,300** in*



Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.

- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **542** days respectively.
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **512** days respectively.
- ***Handarat Camp:*** - Residents have left the camp for **714** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - It is now almost 356 days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:*** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
