Turkey

The AGPS received news reported that Turkish authorities released Palestinian Syrian and Syrian detainees who were arrested the day before yesterday while trying to leave the Turkish territory by sea to Greece.

Facebook pages shared a video of two boats of the Turkish Coast Guard intercepted a boat that was carrying nearly 100 Palestinian and Syrian refugees while trying to reach Europe, while sounds of shooting were heard, and chants of refugees, while activists confirmed that the refugees were transferred to a prison in the Turkish city of Antalya.

In the same context, the Turkish authorities deport a number of refugees from Syria, including nine Palestinian Syrian refugees on May 30, 2015 to northern Syria after being arrested while trying to reach Greece.

It is noteworthy that Turkey is one of the most important transit points, especially for Palestinian and Syrian refugees who fled the furnace of war in Syria, while immigrants go through land and sea in spite of the seriousness of their lives.

Victims

The 17-year-Palestinian boy "Marcel Adnan Khalifa," from the city of Doma in Damascus suburb, died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime, where his family only received his death certificate without his personal ID and his own purposes. The death certificate stated that he died on May 25, 2012, while the AGPS could not assure the

news from other sources; especially since there are similar cases have occurred previously, then some of them turned out to be alive.

It is noteworthy that Khalifa was arrested while passing through Jeser Mesraba checkpoint of the Syrian regime, while he was 17 years back then, and now he is 20.

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team revealed that the number of victims from Al Raml camp in Latakia, who died since the beginning of the events in Syria, has reached "18", including 10 victims died due to torture, 2 victims died by sniper shot, 3 victims died by gunshot, 2 victims were kidnapped and killed, and another victim died due to a health crisis.

The AGPS has documented the names of 70 detainees from Al Raml camp in Latakia since the beginning of the events of the war in Syria.

Recent Updates

A number of mortar shells targeted the sides of Al Nairab camp in Aleppo yesterday, as it targeted the airport vicinity and Al Rabeia Hall, which resulted in only material damages. Meanwhile a state of anxiety and tension still prevails among the residents as a result of the deteriorated security situation in the areas adjacent to the camp.

The location of Neirab adjacent to the military airport has made it a strategic location for the conflict parties in Syria, while it was subjected previously to bombing and shooting which led to casualties among civilians, and many residents were killed because of their involvement in the events of war in Syria, since some of them are fighting with al-Quds Brigade group alongside Syrian troops and some of them are fighting alongside armed opposition forces.

On the other hand, the remain residents of Deraa camp are suffering of acute crises in basic services because of the great destruction of the camp after repeated shelling, which led to extensive damage to the infrastructure of the camp.

It is mentioned that most families of the camp, who are nearly 4,000, families was forced to flee the camp because of the poor conditions, while only about 100 families remained and suffer of difficult living conditions, where basic services are almost non-existent, especially with regard to health services, electricity, and drinking water.

On the other hand, a group of Palestinian Syrian youth managed to access to the European countries of asylum, after suffering and severe

difficulties faced them during their way on foot from Neirab to Greece then Europe.

In details, and to escape from the hell of the war in Syria and the arrest campaigns carried out by the Syrian security forces and members of al-Quds Brigade in Neirab, number of youth decided to Immigrate to European countries on foot, where they launched from their camp in the city of Aleppo and entered Turkish territory that do not grant Palestinian refugees a visa, to enter its territory illegally on foot through smugglers.

The youth resumed their way until they reached the Greek territory, and then headed towards the European countries on foot. Real difficulties and suffering experienced by refugees in the new wilderness trip, where they had to walk in unsafe areas between forests and bush extended in European transit countries such as Hungary and Serbia countries, so as to avoid arrest by border police, and because it is less expensive than other methods.

It is noteworthy that thousands of Palestinian Syrians arrived in Europe during the last four years, illegally, either by sea or by land or air;

dozens of victims were killed, while some of them had been arrested and live in inhumane conditions in Serbia, Macedonia, and Hungary's prisons for many months.

Meanwhile, residents of Khan Dannon camp are suffering of clear relief shortage in light of the difficult economic conditions in which they live, owning to the absence of charitable associations or committees inside the camp as a result of security restrictions by the regime forces, in addition to the arrest campaigns against several relief activists prompting these committees to close their doors in order to preserve the lives of activists.

The residents of the camp, which is considered the poorest among the Palestinian refugee camps in Syria, rely on the financial and relief assistance provided by UNRWA from time to time.

• 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 883 detainees, and 398 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 711 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 781 days, water was cut for 271 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 592 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 573 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 775 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 418 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL SaiedaZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
