Victims

The Palestinian refugee, Ibrahem Fayez Deib, from Khan Dannon camp died due to wounds he attained by shelling at eastern Ghouta in Damascus suburb, raising the toll of the Palestinian victims, who died since the beginning of events in Syria to 3031 victims, according to the AGPS documented statistics.



Lebanon

Information Division of the Lebanese Internal Security Forces arrested 40 Palestinian Syrian refugees including women and children yesterday while trying to leave the port city of Tripoli by sea through the a boat illegally to Turkey and then to European countries.

In a telephone interview, Dr. Mahmoud Hanafi, head of the Palestinian human rights institution "Shahid," confirmed to the AGPS correspondent in Lebanon that the institution is following the situation of Palestinian refugee detainees closely. He said: "The Lebanese authorities promised not to hand over anyone of them to the Syrian authorities, adding that the Lebanese General Security in such cases needs to take legal procedures to know the details of the case and access to the smuggler who arranged the trip. He noted that the detainees will be released immediately upon completion of those procedures, which lasts between two to three days.

It is noteworthy that the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon suffer of miserable living and legal conditions in Lebanon, pushing them to find ways to escape after fleeing from the ravages of the Syrian war, as they are about 45,000 refugees.



Recent Updates

Syrian regime forces targeted Zakia Khan Al Shieh road with heavy machine guns coincided with violent clashes between the Syrian army and armed opposition groups at Al Salam highway.

Zakia Khan Al Shieh road is the only road that supplies the residents with materials and food, as it considered the most dangerous where it always subjected by the Syrian army, while all other roads are still closed. Most residents were killed while passing by Zakia road, even residents called the road with "road of death."

Furthermore, Jafra Foundation started distributing a new batch of humanitarian aid to the people of Yarmouk who fled to the towns of "Yalda, Babbila, and Beit Sahem."

The foundation said it has distributed more than 1,000 food rations have been entered via Beit Sahem crossing.



Meanwhile, residents of Yarmouk are still suffering of harsh living conditions, in light of the high prices, the lack of financial resources, and stop entrepreneurship under the siege imposed on them for (820) days respectively, in addition to the control of ISIS and Nusra over the camp, which cause migration of thousands of residents to the neighboring areas.

Nearly 6,000 Palestinian families who fled from the Yarmouk refugee camp and other camps to Qudseia area in Damascus suburb are still suffering as a result of the security deterioration in the region between the Syrian opposition and the regular army forces between now and then. In addition to the arrest campaigns carried out by the regular army and the closure of roads linking Qudsaya with the city center, which impacted negatively on them and push many families to flee again from Qudseia district to areas within the city of Damascus and its suburb.

In terms of living aspect, hundreds of Palestinian families displaced from the Yarmouk camp to Qudseia district demanded the Palestinian and

Syrian authorities to find a solution to their plight, by lifting the siege on the Yarmouk camp, to allow the introduction of food and medicine, and to allow their return to their homes and property.

This demand came as a result of harsh living conditions in which they live, namely the high cost prices, the widespread unemployment, and the lack of income for most of these families who had to rent houses at high prices, what caused them economic and material crisis over their plight and the loss of their homes and properties in the Palestinian camps.


Release

Syrian security services released the Palestinian refugee "Khaled Azzam," in his fifties, from Nairab camp after being detained for more than two months and a half. The AGPS has documented 84 detainees from Neirab camp in the Syrian regime's prisons, as the regime still reticent about their fate and practice all forms of torture against them according to some of the released testimonies.



Detainees

Syrian security services continue being reticent on the fate of more than 1,500 Palestinian refugees in its jails, despite the continued demands for

their release and for disclosure of their fate. The AGPS documented 976 detainees, including children, women, elderly, brothers, fathers, sons, and entire families, while hundreds of them died under Torture.

The detainees were distributed on all Syrian areas and refugee camps, where the largest number of detainees is at Al Aedein camp; 180 detainees were documented, in the Yarmouk camp death toll reached 126 detainees, in Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb 102 detainees, while in Neirab in Aleppo 84 detainees, in Raml camp in Lathakeia78 detainees, in Al Aedein camp in Hama the total number is 52 detainees, and dozens of detainees were documented in the rest of the camps.

The Syrian security services are still reticent about the fate of detainees, as well as their families fear for their lives from the oppression of regime members.

The detainees have been subjected to all kinds of torture, while 418 Palestinian refugees were killed; 77 of them were identified through the leaked images of victims of torture, and is worth mentioning that the testimonies of released detainees confirm the presence of babies in the Syrian security branches.

Turkey

"Anatolia" Turkish news agency reported that the Turkish coast guard managed to rescue 97 Syrian refugees drowned off the coast of the states of Aidan Jnaq Castle, during their attempt to travel to Greece illegally.


The agency said that water began to flow in the boat, after a rubber boat, that contains 20 people, was punctured after a short period of sailing, where 97 refugees were on the boat while heading to the Greek island of "Madelli," illegally.

Information also reported that the refugees were trying to cross into Greece, off the coast of the Turkish district of "Aevajak," despite the bad weather, and a panic state prevailed after the flow of water to the boat, which led to the fainting of two women in the boat.



Numbers and Statistics till 30/9/2015:-

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 820 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 890 days, water was cut for 380 days

respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.

- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 682 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 883 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 528 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
