"Targeting Handarat Camp in Aleppo with Explosive Barrels"



Handarat camp

- Khan Danoun is without electricity for the third day respectively.
- 62 days on the water cut in the Yarmouk camp.
- The Transportations crisis in Khan Al Sheih was negatively reflected on the food materials prices.
- To pay the rent houses costs is amongst the most prominent challenges for the displaced Palestinian families.

Recent Updates

Handarat camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo was exposed to violent bombing with explosive barrels which led to mass material damages in people houses. It is mentioned that the camp is under the control of the Syrian military Opposition, the residents were displaced from their camps due to the clashes between the Opposition and the Regular Army and from targeting their camps with explosive barrels and heavy missiles.

The residents of Khan Danoun camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus Suburb are complaining from the power cut for the third day respectively. Their suffering is increasing in light of the shortage of fuel especially with the winter season coming. A worry and tension state spread out in the camp amongst the residents due to the security situation deterioration in the surrounding areas. It is mentioned that the camp receives hundreds of displaced Palestinian families from the surrounding towns and Palestinian camps.

In Damascus, the water cut on the Yarmouk camp enters its third month respectively where the residents were obliged to carry small amounts of water from the surrounding areas which increased the consequences of the strict siege that is imposed on the camp by the Regular army and the PFGC. There are no food materials or fuel in addition to the power cut and the absence of medical services in light of the stop of all hospital and clinics except the Palestine hospital which works with its minimum capacity.

On the other side, the suffering of Khan Al Sheih camp in Damascus Suburb continues in light of the transportation crises due to the cut of all roads that connect the camp with the surrounding areas except Zakia road in Khan Al Sheih. The roads cut was negatively reflected on the availability of food and on the prices of food materials where the cost of the fuel liter is about 1.5\$ and the Gas cylinder is about 13\$ the wood ton is about 250\$.

On the other hand, the displaced Palestinian refugees in Syria are suffering from economic crises the most important is the high cost of rent houses that they are displaced to, the costs are from about 150\$ to 350\$ and this comes in light of the high rate of unemployment. It is mentioned that most of refugees lost their work because of the war. It is referred that Al Zahra and Al Maydan in Jerma and Qudseya and Khan Danoun camp are the most camps that receive Palestinian displaced refugees.

Arrest

A group from the military Opposition arrested the young man Mahmoud Alnaji from Al Nairab camp in Bensh area while he was heading to Turkey.

Reports

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria, Studies Department, issued a new documentary report titled as "Camps without Refugees". The report explains, in its 23 pages, the situations in Al Sbeina camp, Al Husayneyya Camp and Handarat camp which is completely empty of its residents due to the clashes and violence. Some of these camps became under the control of the Syrian Regime, the Palestinian factions and the popular committees that follow the regime with the prevention of its residents to return back to their houses as in Al Sbeina and Al Husaeneyya camps in Damascus Suburb, and some became under the control of the Syrian Opposition but it is still a battlefield as in Handarat camp which is near Aleppo in the northern of Syria.



The report presents detailed statistics for the Palestinian victims who live in these camps and died due to airstrikes and artillery shells in addition to the clashes between the Opposition and the Regime. The report referred to that the camps were left and it residents were separated in light of weakness and silence of the international and Palestinian Official organizations. It mentioned the failure of those organizations to provide the requested protection for the refugees and civilians that are available in the international conventions and the International human rights conventions.

The Palestinian Syrian refugees have become in need for anything that would restore their balance again, after the events in Syria have taken away everything, and returned them to a stage that they cannot determine the chances of recovery, temporally or spatially. They have been repeatedly displaced and asked for asylum during the crisis that has been extended for more than three years.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 492 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 575 days, water was cut for 62 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 155 victims.
- 41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- 93 PLO members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 394 days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 363 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 563 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 209 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- Khan Danoun Camp: Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- Al Nairab Camp: Power is still cut for more than a year.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
