



"454 Palestinian Female Refugees Killed in War-Torn Syria, 77 Locked up in Regime Jails"



- Heavy shelling, clashes rock environs of Khan Al-Shih Camp in Damascus Suburbs
- PLA reportedly involved in onslaughts and blockade on Khan Al-Shih
- Bread loafs handed out to Yarmouk displaced residents in Yalda after one month and a half
- Power cut off in Al-Husseiniya Camp for over 12 hours a day



Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of 454 Palestinian female refugees in the beleaguered Syrian territory due to warfare, the blockade, hostilities, and torture in Syrian government jails.

The group also kept record of the detention of 77 Palestinian female refugees in Syrian regime lock-ups, most of whom have had unknown fates.



The overall death toll of Palestinian refugees in Syria has gone up as high as 3,385 while the number of detainees has hit 1,118.

In another development, Khan Al-Shih's surrounding ranches were subjected at the crack of dawn on Wednesday to heavy shelling using explosive barrels, missiles, and artilleries. Deadly clashes burst out between Syrian rebels and government outfits across the nearby Darousha flashpoint.

Meanwhile reports emerged in Damascus outskirts on the involvement of units from the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) in the ongoing offensives and the blockade on Khan Al-Shih Camp for Palestinian refugees. Pro-

regime PLA units have reportedly been assisting the government forces in tightening the noose around refugees' neck in the area.

Families of PLA officers and enlisted refugee recruits in Syria have often voiced their firm rebuff of underway attempts to drag their children into ongoing hostilities. Several Palestinian refugees refused mandatory military enlistment and have sought asylum in other countries for fear of being kidnapped and killed.



In another development, bread packages were delivered by the Palestine Relief Department to the residents of Yarmouk Camp who have been displaced to the nearby towns of Yalda, Babilla, and Beit Sahem. The move was carried out following a hiatus of one month and a half due to disagreements between the Yarmouk Committee and the Syrian Red Crescent over the quantity and quality of bread.

ISIS and Fatah Al-Sham militias have been taking hold of the camp at the same time as a tight blockade has been imposed by the government battalions for over 1,240 days. The regime forces have also cut off power

and water supplies to the camp. At least 190 refugees were killed due to undernourishment and medical neglect in the camp.

Meanwhile, residents of Al-Husseiniya Camp have sounded cries for help over the frequent power outages for up to 12 hours a day. Their appeals for an urgent intervention have gone almost unheeded while none of the promises made by the local municipality and pro-government civil committees to secure electricity have seen the day.

On August 16, 2015, a number of displaced Palestinian refugee families returned to Al-Husseiniya Camp following a two-year ban slapped by the Syrian regime militias.



In the meantime, the Lebanese Association for Humanitarian Assistance, in partnership with the Refugees' Fund Committee, handed out on Saturday and Sunday winter clothes to a number of Palestinian and Syrian refugees displaced from war-tattered Syria in the Lebanon-based Ein Al-Hilweh Camp.

Some 726 Palestinian-Syrian families have been taking shelter in Ein Al-Hilweh refugee camp in the southern Lebanese city of Sidon.

Palestinians of Syria: November 09, 2016 Statistics:

- There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.
- 42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,240 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,299 days and 760 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 190.
- Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,093 days running.
- Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,285 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.
- Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 943 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.
- Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.
- Khan al-Shih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 41 days running.
