Victims

The PFGC announced the death of six of its members due to violent clashes that broke out yesterday in the Yarmouk camp; they are: Mufeed Al-Salam, Maher Abu Zard, Hussein Tameem, Nidal Hijo, Mohammed Rayan, and Zuhair Qadoura.

It is worth mentioning that violent clashes broke out yesterday between the Regular Army alongside PFGC groups and ISIS alongside Al Nusra Front.



Turkey

In a meeting with the Palestinian Ambassador in Ankara Dr. Fayed Mustafa, the AGPS represented by its coordinator Mr. Ahmed Hussein briefed Dr. Mustafa on the situation of Palestinian refugees of Syria.

Dr. Mustafa was also briefed about the conditions of Palestinian refugee camps and the consequences of war, such as destruction of homes and infrastructure, and the targeting of the Palestinian human, where it has resulted in the displacement of large numbers of refugees inside Syria,

and the displacement of large numbers to other countries, particularly Turkey.

In this context, the AGPS called for the Palestinian embassy to work in order to improve the conditions of the displaced Palestinian refugees of Syria in Turkey, through facilitating procedures and provide legal alternatives, especially since most of them were forced to enter the country illegally to escape the war in Syria.

On top of these facilities is granting the Palestinian Authority passport and seeking to secure a settlement with the Turkish government for violators of the residency requirements.

For his part, the Ambassador stressed that it was a priority to put the issue in his meeting with Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan by offering newly credentials, as well as with the Turkish foreign minister, and promised to make more efforts in the future.

It is worth mentioning that 3000 to 5000 Palestinian Syrians had fled to Turkish territory to escape the war in Syria.

Recent Updates

Mortar shells targeted different parts of Yarmouk camp in Damascus, this evening, causing material damage, coincided with clashes between Al-Nusra Front alongside ISIS and the regular army alongside affiliated groups.

It is worth mentioning that the regular army and PFGC groups impose a strict siege on the Yarmouk refugee camp for (742) days, which killed (177) Palestinians because of malnutrition and medical care shortage.

On a different topic, a group of ISIS members wiped Photos of the Palestinian President "Yasser Arafat" in the Yarmouk refugee camp in black, considering those pictures as calls to disbelief.

According to residents, ISIS considered Photos of the Palestinian leaders as images of disbelieve calls, as well as, it prevents Palestine flags considering it as representing non-Islamic flags.

It is worth mentioning that many activists from the camp, journalists, and relief workers were forced to leave, fearing for their lives after they

received death threats from ISIS, which stormed the camp early April with support and facilities of Al Nusra Front, which was present in the camp.

In Damascus suburb, artillery shelling targeted the vicinity of Khan Al Shieh camp at dawn yesterday from the Syrian army site in Talet Al Kabouseia accompanied by Shilka tanks which some of their shootings entered the camp, as violent clashes broke out at Al-Salam highway between the regular army and the armed opposition groups.

This comes in light of the continued interruption of all roads that connect Khan Al Sheih camp with the adjacent areas except Zakia Khan Al Sheih road, which is the only road for the camp's residents. It is noted that the street is being directly targeted by the Army and led to victims amongst residents.

It is mentioned that Talet AL Kabouseia forms a nightmare to Khan Al Sheih residents due to the harm and damage it caused to the residents by that military location.

Where shelling by tanks, heavy artillery and mortar fire, led to many victims and injured people. The AGPS documented 134 Palestinian refugee victims from Khan AL Sheih camp most of them died due to bombing by warplanes and artillery.

Germany

Some Palestinian Syrian activists called to a set-in in Berlin the capital of Germany titled as "Yes to Cancel Dublin Conviction No.3, on Friday,


10th of July 2015 in front of the Representative office of the European Commission at Berlin. The protest came to stop the transfer operations for the people who put their fingerprints in the crossing European countries and to support the refugee's rights in determining their destiny.

Dublin III Regulation provides that the first country that the refugee entered in his way to European, the country would be concerned to study his asylum. The Palestinian Syrian refugees, who escaped the hell war in Syria, are exposed to violence and detention by the authorities to force them to leave their fingerprints during their way through Italy, Bulgaria, Hungary, and Poland. Moreover, when the refugees reach Germany their Asylum application is refused and they will face transfer except some cases.

The protestors demand their right to self-determination and to choose the country that they want to travel to and to apply the asylum application and settle in it, moreover to cancel the decisions that return the refugees back to the European transit countries.

The Palestinian Syrian refugees at Dortmund city in Germany carried out previous set-ins and entered an open protest to achieve their demands and to speed their procedures and not transferring them. The head of Immigration Department at Dortmund said to the protestors" We can't achieve the demands because we have a shortage in employees" The speech was not welcomed amongst the protestors and decided to continue their protest till they achieve their demands.

The Activists said that the protests and set-in succeeded in some cases and each day they have the media and public impact in Germany and it is

spread in the German states. It is noted that many German organizations support the movements of the refugees and call to achieve their demands.



From the set-in in Berlin

Numbers and Statistics till 9/7/2015

- 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 742 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 812 days, water was cut for 302 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 623 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 604 days respectively.

- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 806 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 449 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
