The suffering of Palestinian-Syrians in Lebanon does not limit to alive people, and does not end by one's death, it continues even after death, the AGPS says, where death reveals another kind of Palestinian-Syrians' suffering in Lebanon.

The fees to be paid after death are (300\$) for the forensic medical report,

and the rest of official

procedures could cost (1,500\$)
knowing that the cost of the tomb
is settled. All that costs must be
paid in advance or the body will
be kept in mortuary and hospital
fees will increase, every one of
Palestinian-Syrians in Lebanon
"has to secure this amount of

money before he dies!!" activists say.



In this context, the Committee of Palestinian-Syrians in Lebanon had announced, previously, that it managed to help a Palestinian family to pay that costs to bury their son in Siblien cemetery.

It should be noted that the number of Palestinian Syrians in Lebanon is about (42.5) thousands according to UNRWA's census, while unofficial census indicated that the number has been decreased recently to (33) thousand refugees.

RECENT UPDATES

The Eastern vicinity of Khan Eshieh Camp has been exposed to mortar shelling, yesterday, with no injuries reported so far. This comes while the roads of the camp are still closed back and forth by the Assad's army which led to aggravate the suffering of the civilians inside, and increased the prices of basic materials and goods within the camp.



In south of Damascus, the remaining residents of Yarmouk camp are still suffering from the continuing cut of running water for 481 days, which pushes them to travel to the adjacent areas to collect some drinking water, while activists assured that many residents depend, almost completely, on artesian wells' water although most of it is contaminated by dust and sediment, which leads to the spread of many diseases, renal diseases, including private and public hygiene.

In another context, and as part of "Rajien" Campaign, Jafra foundation continues, for the fourth day, distributing relief aid to displaced families of Yarmouk camp in nearby towns.

It should be noted that almost all of the relief organizations had been closed or kicked out of the Yarmouk camp when ISIS broke into the camp and imposed control over it.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 10 January 2016

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 922 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 982 days, water cut for 482 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 918 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 983 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 636 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.

- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.
