Latest Developments

Reporting from southern Syria, AGPS news correspondent said a number of Palestinian refugees sustained wounds in a round of violent clashes that flared up in Deraa and AlMenshiya neighborhood between the Syrian government forces and the opposition outfits.

The list of injured refugees included Nadim Hamdan, a resident of Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Syria.



Meanwhile, reports emerged on Friday on an onslaught by the government forces that targeted AlSadd Road, housing Palestinian families, with four barrel bombs. Heavy material damage was wrought by the offensive on civilian homes and structures.

Palestinian refugees in southern Syria, particularly in Deraa Camp, have been enduring dire conditions due to the security mayhem rocking the area. 70% of Deraa Camp buildings have been razed to the ground in the raging warfare.

AGPS documented the death of 364 Palestinian residents of Deraa province since the outbreak of hostilities in Syria.

At the same time, violent confrontations flared up at AlShuhadaa crossroads in blockaded Yarmouk Camp between the pro-regime Filastin AlHurra (Free Palestine) Movement and ISIS militias.

Youngster Mahmoud Mundher AlKoukou, nicknamed Abu Samer, from Filastin AlHurra battalion, was rushed to a hospital so as to be treated for injuries sustained in the clashes.

At least 850 Palestinian refugees were fatally gunned down in war-torn Syria, according to AGPS data.



In the meantime, residents of Yarmouk and Deraa camps have launched cries for help over the acute water crisis, saying they have been forced to drink water spouting from contaminated artesian wells.

Speaking with AGPS, experts warned of the life-threatening diseases inflicted by the unhygienic artesian wells due to the germ-infested deposits accumulated in the absence of water-disinfection endeavors.

The Syrian government has cut off water supplies to Yarmouk Camp for over 870 days running and to Deraa Camp for over 1,063 consecutive days.

In another development, Palestinian refugee Alaa AlDeen Jamal Mahmoud, aged 39, has been held in Syrian government penitentiaries for the fourth year running.

Mahmoud, a civil servant and a resident of Yarmouk, Camp, was kidnapped by the government troops in 2013 from Aleppo province. His fate has been shrouded in mystery.

AGPS kept account of the incarceration of 1,173 Palestinian refugees in Syrian regime lock-ups, among whom 86 female detainees.

Palestinians of Syria: March 10, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,456 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,174 Palestinian refugees, including 86 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,358 days in a row.

- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,063 and 871 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,407 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 141 days.
- Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,212 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
