"As the Battle Intensifies Between ISIS and Al-Nusra; Residents Appeal for Opening the Roads"

RECENT UPDATES

For the fourth day, clashes between ISIS and Al-Nusra Front continues in the Al-Yarmuk streets where ISIS is working hard to cut supply-lines coming from the nearby Al-Qadam to Al-Nusra Front.

Meanwhile, the AGPS received many letters from civilian families trapped in the clashes areas calling for a cease fire and water entry. The Ongoing clashes have prevented civilians from going outdoors to secure food and water, put high risk on lives of those who inhabit the area, especially after booby-trapping the houses by Al-Nusra members to stop the progress of ISIS.



Moreover, reports mentioned the robbery of two main water pumps used to supply drinking water to the civilians, the Palestine Garden's pump as well as Al-Jarmaq School's pump which was installed by Palestine Charity Association before.

Activists talked to our correspondent about tens of families trapped at the clashes area who refused to leave their houses because they fear from the robbery acts which looted all empty houses before.



To north of Syria, where Al-Ramoussa Road which connects Al-Nayrab Camp to Aleppo City was cut due to sniper shots targeted civilians crossing the road back and forth.

The sniping acts caused full stop of movement and transportation of students and employees who cross the road on daily basis.



It is noteworthy that the camp witnesses a state of instability and tension for years, because of its geo-military strategic location near the airport, which pushed the fighting parties to engage in endless battles to control the region, while many of the camp's residents were conscripted in the pro-regime brigades such as Al-Quds's.

In Homs, the security forces of the Syrian regime have raided Al-Aydeen camp many times recently, arrested three Palestinians at least, two of them were taken from their houses "Ayman Al-Toubeh" in his thirties, and "Nouriddin Al-Qudsi Abu Mohammad" in his sixties and father of three detainees, both of them were taken to unknown destination.

The third was "Ibrahim Al-Haj Abdullah" nicknamed "Ibrahim Khillou" he was arrested on 3 April 2016 in Al-Inshaat area when heading to his



work habitually, despite he holds the pro-regime's PFLP-GC identification card and works for it officially.



On the other hand, activists confirmed to the AGPS that around 40 percent of the original residents of Al-Hosaiyniya camp have not return back to their houses until today. The reason behind that is the fears of arrest as the regime's troops are controlling the camp's entrances and exits, and have already arrested many youths under many fake pretexts such as advocating the opposition and/or providing relief and medical care to it.

In the same camp, the AGPS has documented women arrested by the regime's checkpoints in addition to bombing houses of media and relief activists inside the camp.

It is noteworthy that the returning process had started on 16 August 2015 after full closure of the camp continued for two years.



Palestinians from Syria in numbers and statistics Until 10 April 2016

- *15,000 Palestinian refugee from Syria in Jordan,*
- *6,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics of July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian refugee from Syria arrived Europe by the end of December 2015.*
- *Al-Yarmouk Camp: still under the siege imposed by Syrian Regime's Army and the PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command for 1030 days. Power cut for 1091 days, water cut for 580 days. The number of victims resulting from the siege is 186.*
- *Al-Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning to their houses for 886 days.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1078 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: water cut continues for 739 days. 70% of its buildings are destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-Aedein camp of Hama: A relatively quiet situation with economic crises.*
- *Khan Eshieh Camp: All roads linking the camp to the city are still closed back and forth except for Zakia-Khan Eshieh road.*
