Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"By force... ISIS urges the people of the Martyrs' Sector in Yarmouk camp to evacuate their homes"

- A member of the Palestinian Liberation Army dies in Ghouta, in the suburbs of Damascus
- A member of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command, dies in the ongoing clashes in Duma
- Palestinian Liberation Army announces the return of its prisoners in Duma
- Syrian security releases the former Mayor of Neirab camp, after being detained for about three months



Victims

Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Adnan Qobea," from the ranks of the Palestine Liberation Army, has died while participating in the ongoing fighting in the eastern Ghouta, in the suburbs of Damascus.

Meanwhile, Palestinian "Mohammed Nedal Foura," member of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command, died on the 9th of April 2018, while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces, in the ongoing clashes in Duma, in the eastern Ghouta.

Latest Developments:

ISIS, which is in control of large areas in Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus, has forced the residents of the Martyrs' Sector neighborhood in the camp, to leave their houses.



According to our correspondent, members of ISIS forced the residents in the buildings extending from Loubia Street to Yarmouk Secondary School for Girls, to leave their homes under the threat of



weapons. At the same time, ISIS announced the Martyrs' Sector a closed military zone.

There were also reports that some of the families were forced to leave their homes, and head to the nearby town of Yelda.

This comes as the Syrian regime and its pro-Palestinian groups continue to mobilize their forces at the entrances of Yarmouk. Media sources close to the Syrian regime stated that military crowds of the Syrian regime forces and the National Defense Forces, headed to the Tadamon neighborhood and the entrance of Yarmouk camp the day before yesterday, in preparation for a new military operation aimed at controlling the entire southern region; Yarmouk camp, Tadamon, Al-Hajar Al-Aswad and Al-Qadam, in which ISIS and Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham have spread their forces.

In another context, the Palestine Liberation Army announced that it retrieved 6 of its members; "Ahmed Ziad Al-Khatib," "Mofeed Majid Qadoura," "Ahmed Sabry Shaaban," "Mahmoud Adnan Qabila," "Abd Al-Latif Mahmoud Saeed" and "Mohammed Mahmoud Moussa."





They were kidnapped by Jaish Al-Islam in Duma, in the eastern Ghouta. The Liberation Army added that the return of its abducted members was part of the agreement reached by with the Syrian Government in Duma, which rules of liberating all of the kidnapped, in exchange for releasing the members of Jaish Al-Islam and their families, to the city of Jarabulus, in the northern suburbs of Aleppo.

In another context, the Syrian security forces released Palestinian refugee, "Samir Horany," after he was detained for about three months, on charges of smuggling youth wanted by the Syrian security, from the Neirab camp. Hourany was the Mayor of the camp five years ago, before he was charged and arrested.

Palestinians of Syria: April 08, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3690, including 467 women
- 1674 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,726 days in a row
- 206 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1462 days, and 1310 days in Yarmouk Camp



- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 558 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
