"Mortar Shells Target Deraa Camp South of Syria"

Recent Updates

A number of heavy mortar shells targeted different areas of Deraa camp south of Syria the day before yesterday, causing no damages. Meanwhile, residents of the camp are still suffering due to the absence of relief and health services, as they did not receive any aid for more than two years.



70% of the camp's buildings were completely and partially destroyed due to the frequent shelling with most types of rockets, missiles, and explosive barrels.

Furthermore, 16 explosive barrels targeted different areas at the outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp in the western suburb of Damascus yesterday.

The shelling came in light of the Regular Army continuous closing of all roads linking the camp with the adjacent areas and towns including Zakia-Khan Al Shieh road, which was targeted continuously with machineguns.

Closing the roads deteriorated the humanitarian and health situation, while residents were prevented from health and emergency services almost completely, in addition to the severe shortage of basic materials; such as bread.

For their part, dozens of residents appealed all relief institutions in Syria to urgently provide the besieged refugees with aid relating to medication and baby milk.

The Syrian Security forces arrested the Palestinians female refugee, Mariam Rashdan-Em Ahmed, while she was passing through Koukab checkpoint adjacent to Khan Al Shieh camp in the western suburb of Damascus. Contact was lost with her for two months before knowing that she is detained at the Regime security prisons. Mrs. Rashdan is a widow and has 4 children; she is a teacher at the UNRWA schools in Khan Al Shieh camp.

The AGPs documented the names of 108 detainees from Khan Al Shieh camp, while the total toll of the Palestinian detainees, since the beginning of war in Syria, has reached 0175 detainees.



Lebanon

Dozens of Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon organized a sit- in in front of the UNRWA's headquarter in Beirut, expressing anger regarding UNRWA's policy, since UNRWA decreased its services and aid, especially the rent allowances.

The number of Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon has exceeded 42.500 refugees, who are suffering of unclear legal situation and cruel living conditions, as the job opportunities is very rare and the houses' rent is very high.



Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 10\05\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1060 consecutive days. Power cut continued for

more than 1121 days, water was cut for 610 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.

- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 914 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1105 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 767 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
