Recent Updates

Five Palestinian refugees from PLA died due to the ongoing conflict in Syria; they are: "Lieutenant "Amer Ouda, Hamza Ayman Husain, Ahmed Anas Darwish, Yaser Ammar Ahmed, and Ahmed Al Masri. They died due to clashes between The Regular Army and the Opposition forces in Bait Nayem eastern Ghouta in Damascus suburb, which raised the victims toll of the PLA since the beginning of the war in Syria to 201, according to the AGPS statistics.



Activists shared through facebook photos for the spread of the PLA members near Yarmouk Camp northern gate, in the area that is controlled by the Syrian Regime.

A State of discontent and worry was spread amongst the Palestinian refugees in the Palestinian camps and compounds in Syria and out of Syria because their sons were involved in the ongoing conflict in Syria and the Palestinians bloodshed in a battle that is not theirs. This came



after the new Palestinian PLA victims, such as the head of PLA Chief of Staff Tarek Al Khadra.



In south of Damascus, a few houses were burnt in the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees due to the continuous violent clashes between Al Nusra Front and ISIS yesterday, they used different kinds of weapons. According to the AGPS correspondent that the houses which were targeted are near Lubia street, where fire flames were seen coming out of the burnt houses. On Tuesday, the dead body of Feras Ghannam, one of ISIS members in Yarmouk, was found dead after days of being kidnapped.

The AGPS correspondent reported that ISIS started to take the shops roll up doors in the Schools Street at the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees to use them to close the between ISIS locations and Al Sham Liberation Organization Locations. It is noted that ISIS fortifies their locations in all fronts specially Haifa Street crossing.

In a different context, AGPS declared to issue a new report that discusses the Palestinian refugees' compulsory immigration to the European



countries and the reasons that led them to go through this way, whether the direct war activities in Syria or the absence of the Arab and Islamic haven for the Palestinians of Syria refugees. The report presents a detailed explanation to the ways that he refugees use to reach Europe and the European formal and popular positions from the flowing of refugees. The report also concentrates on the road obstacles and risks such as death, lost and detention.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics until 10\05\2017

- *The AGPS documented 3494 Palestinian victims, including 455 women.*
- *1602 Palestinians are detained in the Syrian regime intelligence and security branches, including 87 women.*
- *The Regular Army and the PF-GC groups are besieging the Yarmouk camp for 1392 consecutive days.*
- *1955 male and female Palestinian refugees died due to the lack of nutrition and medical care because of the siege; most of them are from the Yarmouk Camp.*
- *It is now more than 1123 days without water in Deraa camp, and 974 days in the Yarmouk camp.*
- *Residents of Handarat camp are prevented from returning to their houses for 1467 days, while the camp is controlled by the Regular Army for more than 201 days.*



- *Almost 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the end of 2016, while the number of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon is almost 31,000, in Jordan 17,000, in Egypt 6000, in Turkey 8000, and in Gaza 1000.*
