Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria

Victims

Palestinian refugee "Ammar Ahmed Moussa" has died on the 7th of October while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces in the ongoing clashes in Deir ez-Zour, east Syria. He was a resident of Al-Sayeda Zeinab refugee camp in the suburbs of Damascus.



Latest Developments

AGPS's correspondent in Deraa camp reported the injury of "Mahmoud Qweider" with shrapnel from an explosive device fired by the Syrian regime forces on the camp. Qweider was transferred to a medical point close to the camp and is in a stable health condition.

Deraa camp residents in south Syria are living in tough humanitarian conditions due to the siege imposed on the area, the lack of financial income and the high prices of resources.





In another context, our reporter in the Damascus suburb confirmed that after the social development committee in the camp coordinated with the Palestine Liberation Army and a branch of the Palestinian intelligence, Head of the Qatna District in the Damascus suburbs agreed to allow two buses to transport residents to and from Deraa camp on a daily basis.

This comes amid the tight security procedures imposed on the residents' movement to and from the camp and intermittent arrests of a number of the camp's residents.

In Lebanon, the General Director of the Directorate of Personal Status, Brigadier-General Elias Khoury, issued a special decree for Palestinian refugees from Syria, to simplify the procedures for the implementation of marriage and birth documents belonging to the Palestinian- Syrian living on the Lebanese territory. The decree holds the number 62/4 issued on 5th October 2017 and condescends on the decree number 43/2 issued on 12th September 2017.





According to the circular, this memorandum came as a result of coordination between the Lebanese-Palestinian Dialogue Committee and the parties concerned with dealing with the problems faced by Palestinians coming from Syria regarding their legal, economic and social situations in general and the difficulties they encounter in the implementation of the personal status on the Lebanese territory in particular.

The number of Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Lebanon has reached 31 thousand, according to UNRWA's statistics in December 2016.

Local Work Committees:

Jafra Relief and Development Foundation in south of Damascus, continues to provide food assistance to the displaced families from Yarmouk camp to neighboring towns of Yelda, Babilla and Beit Sahm, who were forced to leave their homes after ISIS took control of the camp in April 2015.

The Palestinian refugees in Yarmouk camp and the resident of the camp and its neighboring towns are suffering from extremely harsh living conditions because of the continued reflection of the manifestations of the war in Syria.

Palestinians of Syria: October 10, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3597, including 462 women
- 1639 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women

- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,546 days in a row
- 199 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1283 days,
 and 1123 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,619 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 370 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
