Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee Jihad Mansour AlHusain was fatally gunned down overnight by anonymous gunmen.

Jihad, a hairdresser in AlMuzeireeb town, south of Syria, reconciled with the Syrian regime after he had joined opposition committees in Deraa.

Palestinians taking shelter in AlMuzeireeb town continue to express deep concern over the security situation in the area as assassination attempts have increasingly been reported.

Activists have accused pro-government militias of assassinating opposition affiliates south of Syria in violation of the reconciliation accords struck between the two sides.

AGPS has documented the death of dozens of Palestinian refugees in AlMuzeireeb town, home to 1,700 Palestinian families displaced from Daraa Camp.

In another development, representatives of the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees (GAPAR) and UNRWA paid a visit to Hindrat Camp for Palestinian refugees on October 10.

Activists said the visit comes amid attempts to rehabilitate 250 habitable houses along with UNRWA's clinic and Women's Centre.



Civilians have raised concerns over corruption and fraud when it comes to the compensation of those whose houses and property were damaged in the conflict.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees in Damascus, particularly those sheltered in Jaramana Camp, have denounced the mistreatment they have been subjected to by IMO Bank.

Speaking with AGPS, a number of refugees said they have been forced to line up for hours in overcrowded queues outside of the company.

The refugees called on UNRWA to reach out to IMO Bank and pressurize it to take urgent measures in response to their complaints.

After more than 10 years of conflict, Palestine refugees continue to be one of the most vulnerable groups in Syria with immense humanitarian needs.

Palestinian refugees in Syria continue to launch cries for help over their deteriorating humanitarian condition due to the sharp decrease in the exchange rate of the Syrian pound compared to the USD and their lack of access to the local labor market. The price leap has also overburdened the cash-stripped refugees. House rents have also seen a striking hike from previous years.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Ahmad Hamid Bastouni, a resident of AlNeirab Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Aleppo, died of coronavirus.



A state of emergency had been declared over recent months by medics in AlNeirab Camp for Palestinian refugees as an increasing number of residents tested positive for coronavirus.

Along similar lines, residents of Yarmouk Camp and adjacent areas called on the Syrian authorities to lift the sand barriers set up between the camp and AlTadhamun neighborhood.

Civilians said sand barriers block their free access out of and into the area at a time when the Syrian regime forces have regained control over the camp and its surroundings.

Entering its eleventh year, the Syrian warfare has had disastrous fallouts on Yarmouk Camp and other displacement camps set up across the ravaged country. In 2014, the Syrian regime cut off water in the camp, leaving hundreds of families at the risk of death.

Before the crisis started in 2011, Yarmouk was a bustling home to almost 30 percent of the Palestine refugee population in Syria. Today, the weight of displacement, hardship and the loss of loved ones add to the difficult living conditions in Yarmouk.
