Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees in south Syria targeted with mortar shells"

- Violent clashes in Al-Mansheya neighborhood in Deraa
- 250 Palestinian-Syrian families in sorrow because of the intense siege on Ghouta, Damascus
- Immigrants from Syria protest in front of the German embassy in Athens



Latest Developments:

AGPS's correspondent confirmed the targeting of Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees in Syria, using mortar shells yesterday.

According to our reporter, two mortars fell on one of the camp's streets, destroying the residents' houses.

This came amid complex living crises suffered by the residents of the camp, where water and election are still completely cut, in addition to the lack of medical services and UNRWA stopping its aid under the pretext of the security conditions in the region.



In the same context, clashes described as violent broken out between the Syrian regime forces and opposition fighters in Al-Mansheya neighborhood in Deraa. A number of Palestinian and displaced families from Deraa camp are living in the neighborhood, the city and the adjacent Al-Sad Road and are suffering difficult living and security conditions.

In the meantime, the suffering of 250 Palestinian-Syrian families continues in the eastern Ghouta region, due to the



extremely terrible living conditions resulting from the tightened siege imposed by the Syrian regime on the Ghouta neighborhoods and it banning the entry of any food or medical aid to the area.

Based on the data received by AGPS, the families are distributed among the towns of Deraa, Zamalka, Hazeh and Hamouriyah, which are subjected to repeated bombardments, in addition to the towns' extreme lack of food and medical supplies because of the siege. Relief and medical organizations have sent out several calls for help, especially after the widespread of malnutrition among dozens of children.



On their side, the residents renewed their demands through AGPS, to all of the international parties, UNRWA in particular, the official Palestinian parties, the Palestinian embassy in Damascus, PLO and the Arab and European relief organizations, to put a limit to their suffering and deliver their relief aid to them urgently.

The neighborhoods of Ghouta, Damascus, have been under siege since September 2013, however the regime has tightened the siege intensively over the past few days.



In another context, dozens of immigrants, including Palestinians and Syrians, organized a protest on 8-11-2017 in front of the German embassy in the Greek capital Athens, against what they considered a rejection by the German authorities to grant them the permission to meet with their families in Germany,

During the protest, which took place on the streets of Athens, the protestors demanded joining their families in Germany. The immigrants have been in Greece for more than a year and they received the permission to reunite, however their travel permits have not yet been issued by the German government.

A number of humanitarian organizations accused Germany of disobeying the terms of the Dublin Convention, which states that the "reuniting" refugees must not stay in Greece for more than six months



The number of Palestinian-Syrian refugees stranded in Greece are estimated to be 400 refugees, most of which are located on the islands of "Lisbos, Mytelline, Chios, Leros and Kos," including families, women, children and elderly people. They are distributed among the refugee camps or in large halls. Most of the refugees originally came from Yarmouk, Deraa, Al-Aedin and Al-Hussaineyya camps in Syria.



Palestinians of Syria: November 10, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3608, including 463 women
- 1640 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,577 days in a row
- 203 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1314 days,
 and 1154 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,650 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 401 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
