## "12 PLA Members Die in Swaidaa Province Suburb South of Syria"



- Two Palestinians Tortured to Death in the Prisons of the Syrian Regime

#### **Victims**

12 PLA members died yesterday. They are: First Lieutenant, "Mohamed Khaled Al Akhras," Sergeant, "Khaled Al Lafi," "Sergeant" Omar Mahmoud Mari, "recruiter" Jihad Ziad Ahmed, "" Ahmed Mohammed Nouh"," Marwan Safi Khneifis "," Rami Amin Abu Leil, " "Majd Yousef", "Mohammed Shehab Hamad," "Mohammed Al Samra", "Mohammed al-Nuaimi," and "Muhammad Kouri." They died during their participation in the fighting between the regular army and ISIS groups at Swaidaa province suburb Southern Syria, raising the PLA victims' toll that was documented by the AGPS since the beginning of the ongoing war in Syria to (132) victims.

The Palestinian refugee "Wardan Yousef Hijazi" from Al Aedein camp in Homs died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons after being arrested at his home on 26th of February 2015, bringing the number of Palestinian refugees who died due to torture in the Syrian prisons to (381) victims. It is worth mentioning that the Syrian security delivered his ID to his family.

Meanwhile, image of the Palestinian refugee "Laith Abu Rajab," 28 years was identified. The refugee died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons after being detained for two-year and a half; he is from the province of Hama—Al Malaab neighborhood. It is worth mentioning that he is a relief activist in the city of Hama, where he was identified from the leaked images of victims of torture in the Syrian prisons.

#### Recent Updates in the Yarmouk Camp

Sporadic clashes broke out yesterday between Aknaf brigades alongside youth groups and ISIS groups, where Aknaf imposed control at new sites in the vicinity of Loubia Street following these clashes.

ISIS groups withdraw towards Al Hajar Al Aswad area adjacent to Yarmouk and delivered some of its sites to Al Nusar Front.

On the other hand, the health conditions inside the camp were deteriorated after the loss of medical supplies several days ago, while any international body could not enter any emergency medical aid to the camp so far.

On the same context, the camp is on the edge of a severe food crisis due to the stop of entering any food aid for more than two weeks to the besieged residents. It is worth mentioning that the camp was suffering mainly from the suffocating siege imposed by the regular army and PFGC groups

over two years ago that killed (175) refugees due to starvation and lack of medical care in Yarmouk.

Many residents and relief activists inside the camp renewed their refusal towards any military intervention because of the danger it posed

to the lives of about "18" thousand civilians inside the besieged camp.

On the other hand, media reported conflicting news issued by PLO members between support and rejection of a military solution in the Yarmouk refugee camp.

#### Nairab Camp- Aleppo

Pro-Syrian regime groups seized houses of three expatriate families of Nairab Camp, as they expelled the three families despite the intervention of the governor of Aleppo giving orders of not expelling any family who were emigrated or those who are affiliated to the Syrian opposition out of their houses.

The intervention of the governor came after appeals by relatives of those families while the pro-Syrian groups responded to the orders of the governor and the police commander in Aleppo in the first phase, but soon they broke the orders and seizedtheir homes. Seizing three homes caused anxiety to the relatives of the families, especially that some of them are affiliated to the regime and a number of their sons are fighting with pro-Regime al-Quds Brigade. Adnan Sayyed, one of the leaders of al-Quds Brigade in Neirab camp, posted on his website, a decision to seize the

expat homes and threatened that he would not allow the return of those families from the sons of Neirab to their camp in the future. The threats came after the messages of pray for mercy and condolence by the expatriate families following the death of Obada Dahoudi who was fighting in the armed opposition, as Mr. Sayyed accused each of the merciless of treason.

#### Interactions with Yarmouk Camp

Hundreds of Palestinians of Syrian, the Arab Community members and the Turkish People participated in the solidarity sit-in that was organized by Arab and Turkish organizations in solidarity with Yarmouk camp after Friday prayer in front of Fatih Mosque in Istanbul Turkey.

The Sit-in ,which was called to by Fedar, Waqf society and the Association of Muslims Scholars, included speeches that stressed on the necessity to immediately interfere to stop the bloodshed in the Yarmouk camp and driving the armed groups out of the camp and returning the residents back. It is mentioned that about 3000 to 5000 Palestinian

refugees escaped due to the ongoing war in Syria where they were distributed on a number of Turkish Cities.

In a related context, the displaced Palestinians of Syria refugees in Sedi Faraj camp in Algeria organized a solidarity sit-in with the besieged residents of Yarmouk Camp southern of Damascus. The Protestors raised banners that demand to stop the killing inside the camp and to open a safe pathway to enter water, food and medicine to the camp and getting the residents out of the killing circle. They also appealed the Arab League and the United Nations to protect the Palestinian camps and to rescue the Palestinian people and they also condemn the ISIS incursion to Yarmouk Camp. It is mentioned that Sedi Faraj camp is located in the capital of Algeria and includes a number of Palestinians of Syria refugees who escaped from the hell of the ongoing war in Syria.



#### Civil Work Committees

The Charity Commission for the Relief of the Palestinian People and number of organizations distributed food meals to a number of displaced families from the Yarmouk Camp in Zainab Al Helaleyya School, where they distributed food meals and sweets on more than 100 people. It is worth to mention that about 975 families left Yarmouk Camp to Yelda town and Beit Sahem, which surround the Yarmouk camp, due to the ISIS incursion to the camp and bombing with explosive barrels and rockets.

#### Numbers and Statistics till 10/4/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 643 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 723 days, water was cut for 213 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 175 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 543 4days respectively.

- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 514 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 716 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 360 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
