Victims

Three members of the PFGC died during clashed that broke out on several fighting axes in Yarmouk between ISIS alongside Al Nusra and the pro-Syrian regime Palestinian factions.

The victims are: Ahmed Nazzal, Adnan Amairy, and Nasser Ouda; brings the number of PFGC victims who died during the past 24 to nine victims, where it was announced earlier the death of six members.

Meanwhile, Mahmoud Abdul Wahab Zeibaq, a member of the pro-Syrian regime Palestinian Democratic Party, also died yesterday at the same clashes, bringing the number of victims of groups that are besieged Yarmouk camp to ten victims.

The Palestinian refugee Ahmed Mohammed Al Fatoum from the Yarmouk camp died due to torture in Syrian prisons, after being detained for more than a year, bringing the number of Palestinian refugees who died due to torture in Syrian prisons to 406 victims according to the AGPS documented statistics.

Recent Updates

Battles and violent clashes in the Yarmouk camp south of Damascus continued on Friday night between ISIS alongside Al Nisra Front and the regular army alongside the Palestinian factions loyal to it.

The clashes were concentrated on the Yarmouk high school axis at Jalal Kaoush Street near the Yarmouk Municipality and Al Rija square, while the AGPS correspondent reported news about victims in the ranks of both parties.

Meanwhile, mortar shells targeted different parts of the camp after Friday prayers, causing only material damage.

Turning to Latakia northern Syria, where activists of the Action Group reported that Syrian security arrested a number of Palestinian refugees while trying to reach Turkey, including women and young men from the Yarmouk refugee camp, where they were arrested by members of Zahran hospital checkpoint in Latakia, while the AGPS could not assure the news from other sources.

It is noteworthy that hundreds of Palestinian refugees fleeing to Turkey by road and entering Turkish territory illegally, because of Turkish embassies to stop issuing visas for Palestinian refugees from Syria.

Going back to the Syrian south, according to unofficial statistics, frequent shelling, and clashes in Daraa camp southern Syria since the beginning war, caused destruction of about 70% of its buildings.

Meanwhile, the remained refugees inside the camp are living a very serious humanitarian situation manifested in health and living aspects, while there are no hospitals or medical centers in the camp, in addition to the severe shortage of drugs and first aid materials and medical equipment.

In addition to non-availability of ambulances to transport the wounded to receive medical treatment outside the camp, and in case residents success to transfer a patient outside the camp, Jordan refuses entry of any Palestinian refugees from Syria even injuries.

In front of this deteriorating health situation, a number of activists inside the camp warned of the spread of disease among people, especially as they were forced to use contaminated drinking water, due to the drinking water cut in the camp for about 450 days.

In terms of living aspect, residents of Daraa camp are suffering from power outages for long periods of up to several days, as well as the lack of fuels and heating materials, in addition to the loss of many varieties of food and the significant high prices of other materials.

It is worth mentioning that the repeated bombing and the difficult living conditions have forced hundreds of Palestinian families to take refuge in neighboring towns.

On the other hand, Al Taqwa Charity Committee in cooperation with the Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon carried out the second collective Iftar for a number of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon on 22nd of Ramadan, 09/07/2015 in Taqwa Mosque hall at Nahr Al-Bared camp.



Numbers and Statistics till 10/7/2015

- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 743 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 813 days, water was cut for 303 days

respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.

- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 624 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 605 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 807 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 450 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
