Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Members of the Palestine Liberation Army dead and captured in the suburbs of Damascus"

- A member of Fath Al-Intefada dies in Syria
- Night clashes on the axis of Palestine Street in Yarmouk camp
- 25 members of ISIS leave the south of Damascus, in coordination with the regime
- Distribution of mazut to 200 Palestinian-Syrian families in the Lebanese Beqaa



Victims

Palestinian "Ashraf Ismaeil Aly," member of the Fath Al-Intefada Movement, has died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces.

Therefore, the Action Group's documented data reveals that the number of military victims who have died during 2017, is 141 soldiers, indicating the increase in the engagement of Palestinian soldiers in the fighting, which Syria is still witnessing.



Latest Developments

The Palestine Liberation Army, one of the armed Syrian opposition factions, has announced the death and capturing of a number of its members, in the suburbs of Damascus.

The army indicated that it had launched a military operation on a number of the Syrian regime forces' sites in the surrounding areas of Al-Zarekeya and Hazrama, in the eastern Ghouta, stressing that that operation resulted in the capturing of three of its members and the death of 9 soldiers of the Liberation Army, in addition to the acquisition of some weapons and ammunition.



Sources in the opposition reported the names of the captured members from the Palestine Liberation Army. They are: "Ahmed Mahmoud Al-Mousa," Lieutenant "Ahmed Ziad Al-Khateb" and "Mohamed Adnan Qabeea." The Action Group has not confirmed the news and the Liberation Army has not issued anything regarding this.



The Palestine Liberation Army consists of about 6000 members and fights in more than 15 sites across Syria. 3000 of its members are engaged in the fighting.

In the meantime, the Action Group's correspondent that fighting broke out on Wednesday-Thursday night on the axis of Palestine Street, between the Karaeen battalion and the Syrian regime forces and its affiliated Palestinian factions. Light and medium weapons were used in the fighting, and no news of victims or casualties were reported on either side.

The remaining residents of Yarmouk camp are living in harsh humanitarian conditions due to the continuous bombardments and fighting, as well as the siege imposed by the Syrian regime since mid-2013, and the siege imposed by ISIS on the residents in the



western area of Yarmouk camp, which is under the control of 'Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham,' previously known as Al-Nusra.

In the same context, 25 members of ISIS exited the south of Damascus, from the fodder area controlled by ISIS, in the direction of the Bardy checkpoint dominated by the Syrian regime.

Our correspondent quoted a source in Al-Hajar Al-Aswad, ISIS's stronghold, that the members of ISIS left in the daylight, adding that there are talks about secret tasks for the members of ISIS in other areas, including the areas under ISIS's control in Syria.

While sources in south Damascus reported the exit of "Abu Al-Hareth," one of the first-grade leaders in ISIS, and ISIS's former military commander and the nephew of the former leader, "Abu Hesham Al-Khaboury," with the so-called "Abu Omar Ahrar," who pledged to ISIS and was the leader of the "Ahrar Al-Sham" Movement in south Damascus formerly, before pledging to ISIS.

The sources in south Damascus also confirmed the exit of "Abu Mosaab Al-Tarkamany," one of the prominent military commanders of ISIS in the Assaly area, as well as "Eyad Owayjan" known as "Attia," one of the members of ISIS who was accompanied by his brother, through the Maamal Bardy checkpoint that lies between Al-Hajar Al-Aswad neighborhood and Sabinah town in south Damascus, in coordination with Assad's forces.

The waves of the exit of leaders and members of ISIS have escalated, from the areas of its control in the recent past, due to the inside



conflict within ISIS, and the non-payment of its fighters for long periods of time.

Local Work Committees:

The Humanitarian Relief Society distributed mazut to 200 Palestinian-Syrian families in the center and western Bequa area, which was donated by a benefactor.

950 of the Palestinian-Syrian families who were displaced to the Lebanese Beqaa area, are suffering from difficult living conditions, due to the mountainous area and the extreme weather conditions, whether the cold winters or hot summers, in addition to the lack and shortage of the relief aid presented to them by UNRWA, charities and the Palestinian factions and authority.

In addition to their inability to guarantee the expenses of heating materials, due to the rise in their prices, as well as the lack of a financial resource and job opportunities that could help them to secure the basic life necessities.





Palestinians of Syria: January 11, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3634, including 463 women
- 1644 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,639 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1376 days, and 1216 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 474 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
