Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Yarmouk camp bombarded with guided missiles and mortars"

- Resident of Sayeda Zeinab camp dies while participating in the ongoing fighting in Syria
- ISIS informs civilians to leave Al-Hajar Al-Aswad neighborhood and head to Yarmouk camp
- Regime forces bombard the Sad Road neighborhood in Deraa with mortar shells
- Syrian regime continues to detain Palestinian "Bakr Al-Kousy" since 2013



Victims

"Mohammed Kheir Jazeyya" has died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces in Syria. He was a member of the Syrian army rangers, and a resident of the Sayeda Zeinab camp for Palestinian refugees in the suburbs of Damascus.

On its part, AGPS's Monitoring and Documentation Team has confirmed that the number of residents of the Sayeda Zeinab camp who have died since the beginning of war in Syria, has risen to 92 refugees.



Latest Developments:

The Syrian regime forces and its affiliated factions bombarded the neighborhoods of Yarmouk camp with a number of mortar shells. According to our reporter, the mortars fell on the Orouba area and the Taqadom neighborhood, destroying the houses of the besieged civilians.

The regime forces also bombarded Palestine Street and the Tadamon neighborhood with guided missiles, with no casualties reported, as well as targeting the Martyrs' sector with medium and heavy weapons.





In a similar context, ISIS in south Damascus informed the civilians living in Al-Hajar Al-Aswad, ISIS's stronghold, of leaving the area and heading to Yarmouk camp. According to our reporter, ISIS wants to evacuate the neighborhood to transfer it into a military zone.



The labor force from the civil institutions, bodies and local councils and some military factions in south Damascus had previously issued a statement, stressing that almost 6000 civilians are living in Al-Hajar Al-Aswad, Yarmouk camp, Al-Tadamon neighborhood and Al-Assaly region, assuring that the residents of these areas are civilians, not members or loyals of ISIS. The statement also



indicated that children form about 40% of the areas' residents, as well as 30% women, 10% elderly people and 20% men.

In south Syria, the Sad Road neighborhood, adjacent to Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees, was bombarded with a number of mortar shells, targeting different areas in the camp and causing material damage. This comes amid the tense security conditions in south Syria, in the light of the ongoing clashes between ISIS and the armed Syrian opposition factions.

In the meantime, the Syrian regime continues to detain 33-year-old, Palestinian, "Bakr Al-Kousy" from Yarmouk camp, for the fifth consecutive year. He was arrested by members of the Syrian regime's Hossaineyya checkpoint in the suburbs of Damascus on 12-08-2013 and taken to an unknown place. No information about his place of detention or fate have been revealed so far.

AGPS receives a number of messages and information about the detained Palestinians. They are then documented despite the difficulty of recording information because the Syrian regime continues to hide the fate, names and locations of the detainees. The Group has recorded the detention of 1644 Palestinian refugees in the Syrian regime prisons, including more than 105 women.

Palestinians of Syria: February 11, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3651, including 465 women
- 1658 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women

- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,669 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1405 days, and 1244 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 503 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
