

Greece

14 illegal migrants, including 7 children died in the Aegean Sea, western Turkey, as their boat sink off the "Oewagek" town coast of the State of Jnaq Castle, while trying to crossing illegally to Medela Island Lesbos, Greek.

The Turkish Coast Guard teams rescued27 people were aboard the boat.

The Aegean Sea connecting between Turkey and Greece is considered one of the main transit roads for migrants and easy access to the Greek islands near the Turkish territory.

Victims

The Palestinian refugee "Fadi Khateib" from the Yarmouk camp died in Yalda area two days ago, while there are conflicting reports about the cause of his death.



Recent Updates

A group of besieged students left the Yarmouk camp to complete their studies and join universities, where the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees assumed responsibility for the exit of the student and for bring them back to the camp.

On Monday 9/11/2015, members of ISIS and Al-Nusra fabricated clashes with the regime forces and affiliated groups at the Yarmouk Municipality

sector to prevent students who ended high school to get out through that sector to join their universities.



For 11 consecutive days, World Relief Organization in cooperation with the Charity Organization continue to remove debris and dust from the streets of Husseneia camp in Damascus suburb, as part of the rehabilitation homes and mosques project in the camp. Within this project, mosques will be restored, in addition to installing glass windows of most affected houses.

It is noteworthy that the re-restoration and rehabilitation project, which started on November 2015, will run for 15 days.

The Syrian security forces continue detaining approximately 1,000 Palestinian refugees in the prisons, including children, women, elderly, brothers, fathers, sons, and entire families.


Hundreds of them died due to torture, while the fate of the rest was not revealed, while some released detainees confirmed the presence of babies in the Syrian security branches. The AGPS documented 990 Palestinian detainees in the Syrian prisons, including 61 Palestinian refugees their fate is unknown, as it documented the names of 422 victims have died under torture.

Civil Work Committees

Within the annual project "School Bag," Palestine Charity Committee distributed school bags and Stationery on the Yarmouk camp students displaced in areas of Yalda, Babbila, and Beit Sahem. The Committee confirmed that 750 students were benefited from the project in Jerusalem alternative schools, which supervised by Palestine Charity Committee.

2015, while ISIS closed the only high school in the camp, and prevented students leaving to attend their universities, as the Committee's headquarters was looted by ISIS and Al-Nusra Front, including stationery.

Germany

Germany re-applied Dublin agreement after three months of suspension, including Palestinian Syrians and Syrian refugees.

German media sources quoted the statement of the German Interior Ministry spokesman, who reported the re-apply of Dublin Convention rules on refugee for all origin countries and every Member States except Greece starting from 21 last October.

The current settlement does not necessarily mean the refugees returned to the out of bounds, while Germany announced in August a temporary suspension of Dublin Convention for the Syrian refugees, including Palestinian Syrians. The convention terms state the return of refugees to the first European country they had entered and fingerprinted.

The return of refugees to countries that obtained fingerprints is considered one of the most prominent issues that haunt the lives of refugees, while the asylum to Germany of many Palestinian refugees who were fingerprinted was not decided a year ago, which increases the dire situation of refugees after bearing the travel and the seriousness of access to European countries of asylum.

Turkey

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Turkey visited a number of Palestinian Syrian families displaced in the cities of Antakya, Iskenderun, and Krkhan in southern Turkey, in order to see their living conditions, to alleviate their suffering, and to distribute financial aid and winter clothes to those families.

It should be noted that the Palestinians of Syria are suffering from living difficulties in Turkey, especially high rent of houses and working difficulties. Unofficial statistics indicate that the number of Palestinian Syrian refugees in Turkey is about 3,000 to 5,000, noting that Turkey is a crossing country for many Palestinian refugees heading over to European countries.



Lebanon

Palestinians of Syria Workers League carried out, in cooperation with Al "Wafaa" European campaign, lighting project for 14 houses of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Bequa region in northern Lebanon.

This project comes as a continuation of previous stages had been carried out in cooperation with the Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon, to light the houses of displaced families in Lebanon camps and shelters in order to alleviate their suffering, as a result of the dire economic conditions in which they live and because of the continuing power outages.

Numbers and Statistics till 11/11/2015

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 863 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 933 days, water was cut for 423 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 724 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 925 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 569 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
