RECENT UPDATES

Khan Esheih camp was targeted by artillery bombing last night. Several bombs have fallen in different areas in and around the camp. AGPS assured that the source of firing is Alkabousya hill, where the Syrian army based on. Two bombs were dropped in the secondary school road, whereas, one has fallen in the crossroad of Nestlé company.



Firyal Ali was injured due to bombing her house. AGPS correspondence indicates that a panic state spread among civilians, coincided to 4 raids mounted by Syrian warplanes targeted the farms around the camp in the direction of Alsalam highway, in addition to Alabasyeh area and alsaaed road.

In Lebanon, the family of Palestinian refugee "Khaled Abdelhadi" appealed all relief organisations, PLO, UNRWA and Red Cross committee to extend help for its son after his hand had been broken as he slipped on the icy street. The child was moved to Jesus hospital in Beirut where he has been undergone to a surgery cost \$8000.





The destitute family called the organisations for assistance after it failed of securing the cost amid fears from detaining the patient in the hospital. This accident reveals the horrific situation which Palestinians from Syria in Lebanon live in. The difficult economic conditions and unemployment are the most problematic crisis experience refugees. In addition, the illegal state of Palestinian refugees is still unsolved after three years.

In a different context, many Palestinian refugees participated in protests against the recent decisions of UNRWA. The protest was held in Borj-Elbarajneh camp in the Lebanese capital of Beirut. Protesters condemned the UNRWA cut policy, demanding the UN agency to step back of its measures, particularly, health and educational services. It is indicated that 42,000 Palestinian refugees fled Syria to Lebanon in the wake of targeting their camps.



STATISTICS

AGPS indicated that three victims from Alsayeda-Zainb were killed in last January. Tayseer Rahal, Jihad Mohammed Ali and Jihad Mohammed Khalil announced dead after battles between Assad and opposition forces.



NGOs

The charity institution for Palestinian People Relief in cooperating with Alershad wa Eleslah assembly distributed winter aid to Palestinian refugees in Wadi-Alzaini In Lebanon. Officials of charity said 220 families benefited from these packages which covered local destitute families and refugees.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 12 February 2016

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 972 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1034 days, water cut*



for 522 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 828 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1021 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 682 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
