#### Latest Developments

A number of Palestinian refugees from AlQuds Brigade sustained wounds as they fought alongside the Syrian government forces in AlZahra, in Aleppo.

The list of injured refugees included Ahmed Badr, Hesham Abu Hassan, and Wassim Azzam.

Around 500 fighters, out of a total of 3,500 fighters enlisted at the non-Palestinian AlQuds Brigade, have been identified as Palestinians who previously sought refuge in such camps as AlNeirab,



Handarat, and AlRaml. Fighters from Aleppo city and its northern and western suburbs, along with so-called Shabah AlAswad combatants, have also been fighting alongside the AlNeirab-headquarted battalion.

In a related development, Daraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Syria, and AlSadd Road, housing dozens of Palestinian families, sustained material damage after they were struck with mortar shells.

Daraa residents have been enduring dire conditions due to the lack of health services and relief assistance for over a couple of years.

At the same time, violent clashes broke out overnight Tuesday between ISIS militias and Tahrir AlSham Commission in Haifa Street. Light and medium weapons were used in the clashes. No injuries were reported among civilians.

Meanwhile, unconfirmed reports have emerged on an underway agreement between the Syrian government forces and Tahrir AlSham Commission stipulating that the latter retreat from Yarmouk to Idlib, north of Syria. Key to the agreement is the evacuation of the blockaded AlFou'a and Kafriya towns, in Idlib suburbs, in exchange for the evacuation and disarmament of the blockaded AlZabadani and Madaya towns, in Rif Dimashq.

In the meantime, Palestinian refugee Ubeida Ahmed Darwish, aged 18 and sheltered in AlAydeen Camp in Hums, has been held in Syrian government penitentiaries for nearly four years.

Darwish was arrested on May 3, 2013, by the government troops deployed at a checkpoint near Hums campus. His fate has been shrouded in mystery.

In another development, the Palestine Charity Commission distributed allowances to 44 orphans in Damascus as part of underway charity projects aiming to alleviate the crises endured by the Palestinian refugee community in war-torn Syria.

According to one of the campaigners, the move is an implementation of the messages of the Prophet Of Islam Mohammed, Peace Be Upon Him, who once said: "Whoever cares for an orphan will be next to me in Paradise like this", and he held his two gingers together to illustrate.

The charity further handed over children's milk to some 150 displaced Palestinian families seeking shelter in Qudsaya town, in Rif Dimashq.



#### Palestinians of Syria: April 12, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,477 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,183 Palestinian refugees, including 86 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.

- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,364 days in a row.
- 195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,095 and 946 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,439 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 173 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
