Latest Developments

Rallies have swept Palestinian refugee camps in Syria in protest at the deadly Israeli airstrikes on Gaza and crackdowns on Palestinians in occupied Jerusalem.

The rallies took place in the refugee camps of Yarmouk, Jaramana, AlNeirab, Hindarat, and AlAyedeen, among other displacement camps.

Palestinian refugees voiced their strong condemnation of the latest surge in violence by Israeli forces and settler gangs and called on the international community to immediately step in.

In another development, residents of Yarmouk Camp briefed the director-general of the political department of the Palestine Liberation Organization Anwar Abdul Hadi on their dire humanitarian condition due to protracted displacement and homelessness.

This came during a visit by Abdul Hadi to Yarmouk Camp's cemetery.

Meanwhile, a five-member gang burglarized a house in Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Syria, and stole its property.

The gang attacked civilians who showed up at the scene to protect the house and threatened retaliation.



In the meantime, representatives of the ruling Baath Party in Syria ordered shopkeepers to post banners supporting the Syrian President Bashar AlAssad in the upcoming elections.

A number of shopkeepers posted the banners for fear of being fined by the Syrian security forces.

In the meantime, a Palestinian family displaced from Syria said Turkish hospitals have refused to admit their newborn on account that they do not hold kimlik visas.

The family was forced to pay incubator fees at 1,000 Turkish pounds (120 USD) a day.

Nearly 2,400 Palestinian families from Syria have sought shelter in Turkey, including 1,200 families in Istanbul, where they have been facing an abject situation.

Khayra Ummah organization estimated that 400 Palestinian families from Syria without kimlik visas have been taking refuge in Turkey, including 300 families in Istanbul.
