"The Sever Living Situation and the Security Strict Procedures in Cyber City Camp in Jordan Prompt the Palestinian Refugees to Escape"

Victims

The Palestinian young man Rafeeq Tawfiq Afifi died due to his participation in the fighting in Syria. Al Jalil Forces, one of the regime forces, said that Afifi is one of its members and died during performing his national duty. Earlier Al Jalil forces declared its participation in the battles of Tadmor, Aleppo, Deir Al Zoor, and Al Reqa, where a number of its members died due to their participation in fighting beside the Syrian Regular Army in Al Tabaqa Airport and Deir Al Zoor battles.



Al Jalil Brigade is considered the military wing for Al Awda Youth Movement, a military formation that fights beside the Syrian Regime and it is been led by a young man called Fady Al Mallah from Khan Danun camp. It works to recruit the youth of Khan Danun and the camps controlled by the regime through offering money and achieving all their needs.

It is referred that a number of Palestinian factions are fighting beside the Syrian Regime by forming military groups to fight beside the Regime, distributed inside and around the Palestinian Camps and sometimes they participate in fighting in the battles to support the Syrian Regime.



Recent Updates

The Palestinian refugees, who escaped from Syria to Jordan and settled in Cyber city camp, described that the camp is like Guantanamo Prison, where the refugees suffer from the security tighten, the bad humanitarian situation , the humiliation and the media blackout on their suffering. All these led to increase the number of the Palestinians of Syria in Cyber city camp in Al Ramtha north of Jordan, where a number of refugees escape cases were documented from the camp that shelters about 175 Palestinian families who escaped the war in Syria.

It was described as an industrial area surrounded with fences and strict security procedures like a prison and supervised by many Jordanian Security departments. The place was as an accommodation place for Asian workers who were working in the factories of the industrial area in Irbid before it was closed since years due to the instability and protest of workers on the bad level of accommodation, then it was open by a donation from its owner to shelter the Palestinian refugees coming from Syria.





The refugees are distributed on 142 housing units in 5 floors, where they receive the visitors in a piece of land 50 meters far from the housing and it is the only space allowed by the Security. The refugees suffer from bad living situation, where each family that contains five members has only one room and all the floor rooms has one kitchen and bathroom used by all refugees. Tightening on the refugees specially the Palestinian refugees who hold the Syrian documents prompted them to suicide escaping from the severe living situation. A refugee describes the Jordanian security treatment that it is just humiliation, he added" they treat us as suspicious since we reached the Jordanian territories though some of us are Jordan Passport holders but our only problem is that we are Palestinians, in addition we are prevented to visit our relatives as we are in Guantanamo prison".

It is worthy to mention that the Policies Council that is headed by the King Abdullah took a decision in May 2011 to ban the entry of the Palestinian refugees from Syria to Jordan, where politicians explained that Jordan fears that it is about changing the identity of the Palestinians and about find an alternative country instead of Palestine.





In a different context, the news reported from the besieged Yarmouk camp in the southern of Damascus about violent clashes in Palestine Street in the vicinity of Yarmouk municipality with guns and missiles between the Syrian Regime alongside its loyal military groups against Al Qaren brigade which is one of the opposition members and no news about casualties.

It is referred that ISIS and Fath Al Sham front impose their control over, where the Regular Army and the PFGC continue to siege the camp since 1131 days respectively, and cutting water and power. The AGPS documented 187 victims in the Yarmouk camp who died due to hunger and lack of medical care in addition to preventing the food and medical materials to enter the camp.

Unofficial statistics for AGPS refer that more than 80% of the Palestinians of Syria refugees lost their jobs and work due to the war in Syria specially those who work in Palestinian camps. It negatively impacted the Palestinian families in Syria where many children left their schools to find work that doesn't suit them trying to secure their living and to decrease the living costs of their families specially the displaced families and who are obliged to pay the rents like \$150 monthly. In addition to the appearance of many problems related to unemployment such as recruiting the Palestinian youth by military groups and the Palestinian factions and oblige them to fight the opposition and give them a salary not more than \$75 monthly.

Lebanon



Under the name of the Martyr Fatema Shehaby, the Displaced from Syria Al Qastal Scout Guidance Group in cooperation with the Palestinians of Syria Displaced Committee carried out a scout camp in Al Kharroub in Seblin between 4-8\8\2016. They performed some artistic and scout activities for participants and at the end of the ceremony they distributed thanking certificates for those who contributed to the success of the activity in addition to honoring the Martyr Fatema Al Shehaby.

In Wadi AL Zeena, Afaq Center in cooperation with Islamic Relief launched a project titles "protect your child and build your country." The project provides Psychological support to the refugees coming from Syria and many other various activities such as sports, painting, sowing, and theatre in addition to a food meal weekly. The activity targets about 200 students registered in the center. It is referred that the number of the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon according to UNRWA is 42.5 thousands where unofficial statistics refers to that the number was decreased to 33 thousands refugees.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 12\08\2016

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid 2016



- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1151 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1212 days, water was cut for 701 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 18^v.
- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 1004 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1^v96 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 855 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
