Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"The continued closure of the only outlet for Yarmouk camp threatens the lives of more than 3000 besieged people"

Latest Developments:

The military gatherings of the towns south of Damascus, continue to close the only outlet for Yarmouk camp for the second consecutive day, in front of civilian residents of the besieged camp.

Our correspondent said that the armed opposition groups placed more barricades and barrels in the area surrounding the only crossing that links between Yarmouk camp and Yelda, after it had been open for several days for civilians to use.



Activists confirmed to AGPS that the closure of the crossing by the armed Syrian opposition factions in the towns of south Damascus, came after an agreement with the Syrian regime. The latter gave the opposition groups the choice to either close the Yelda/Yarmouk camp barrier, or that the regime closes the Beit Sahm barrier.

More than three thousand families are living in inhuman conditions, of which 35 families have been living under ISIS's siege for more than a month, in the west area of Yarmouk camp, which is controlled by "Al-Nusra" Front. Their fate remains mysterious.

In the same context, the Syrian regime closed the Babilla-Sidi Mekdad checkpoint, as the Syrian opposition forces partially opened

the Beirut checkpoint between Yarmouk camp and Yelda town, before yesterday's sunset, allowing the civilians to pass to and from the camp. The regime prevented some civilians from the residents of the towns of Babilla and Beit Sahm who went out to Damascus, from returning to these towns.

On their part, activists and media people from several areas held a meeting to study the situation in south Damascus. They agreed to form a committee to meet with the leaders of military factions and concerned parties, to find a radical solution to the issue of opening and closing the only crossing between Yarmouk and Yelda and to take practical steps to prevent the repetition of its closure, demanding the neutralization of civilians and their non-involvement in military conflicts.

On another hand, the Syrian regime is hiding the fate of Palestinian refugee "Basel Abdallah Al-Saaedy," after the popular committees affiliated to the regime arrested him in the beginning of 2013 from in front of one of the markets near to Al-Sayeda Zeinab in the suburbs of Damascus. Since his arrest, no information has been revealed about him. He is from the Hejira neighborhood in the Damascus suburbs.

AGPS receives a number of messages and information about Syrian refugees and are successively documented despite the difficulties in obtaining information about the fate, names and locations of the detained as the Syrian regime continues to reserve such data. To this date, AGPS has recorded the detention of 1640 Palestinians in the Syrian prisons, including 103 women.

In Greece, the Doctors Without Borders organization said that more than 2860 refugees sleep in tents inside the Moria camp on the Greek Island of Lesbos Mytilene, demanding an end to this inhumane treatment of refugees.

Hundreds of displaced Syrians and Palestinians on the Greek islands are living cruel suffering with the advent of winter, because they were forced to live in canvas tents between forests and grasslands due to the inadequate places and spaces in the refugee camps.



According to Palestinian refugees who arrived at a number of Greek islands including Lesbos Mytilene, the inadequate camps in accordance to the number of refugees and the lack of sufficient

spaces, has made their lives harsh and miserable under the tents and between the forests. It does not provide the suitable conditions needed to protect them from the heat, cold, winter

Palestinians of Syria: November 12, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3608, including 463 women
- 1640 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,579 days in a row
- 203 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1316 days, and 1156 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,652 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 415 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
