Victims

The corporal officer of the PLA, Abdullah Faisal Hijjo, died during the ongoing clashes in Syria, raising the PLA victims' toll to 107 victims most of them died during the military actions in Damascus suburb, according to the AGPS documentation.

Moreover, the AGPS received news about the death of the refugee "Ihsan Habeeb" who died due to torture in the Syrian Regime's prisons after being detained for more than 4 months. The news reported that Mr. Habeeb was born on 1978 and lives at Jasim city, Daraa Governorate, where the AGPS was unable to assure the news from another source.

Recent Updates

Water was cut for 157 days at the houses of almost 20,000 residents of the Yarmouk camp in Damascus, a long period in which the residents tried to alleviate the negative impacts of this crisis by relying on the neighboring areas to secure a part of the daily water use. The water cut in those areas forced the residents to rely almost completely at the artesian wells, which most of them are polluted with dust and sediments. The polluted water may cause many diseases, especially the diseases of kidney, yet, despite all this risk the residents are helpless to find another source of water.

In an attempt to shed light on this problem, the UNRWA published a short video that shows a child while he fills gray water manually. It is mentioned that many activists inside the camp have warned repeatedly about the spread of many kidney diseases as a result of drinking the polluted water.

Meanwhile, clashes broke out in the Yarmouk camp yesterday which led to the suspension of urgent aid distribution to the Yarmouk residents, who are besieged for 586 days and the checkpoints of the Regular Army and the PFGC groups prevent the entry of food and medical supplies, which resulted in the death of 165 Palestinian refugees due to the malnutrition and the lack of medical care. Furthermore, each of the Regular Army and the Syrian armed opposition groups inside the camp recriminated about the responsibility of these clashes.

On the other hand, the Palestine Charity Commission distributed about 100 food meals on some families inside the Yarmouk camp to alleviate the suffering of the besieged residents. In a related context, the Charity Commission for the Relief of the Palestinian People distributed food parcels on the residents of Khan Danoun camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus Suburb for the second day respectively. The distribution of aids comes after distributing 1200 food parcels on the residents under the supervision of the Commission. It is worthy to mention that Khan Danoun camp suffers of severe living conditions because of the spread of

unemployment, high cost of living and the tensed security situation inside the camp.

In Aleppo, the Syrian Security arrested the refugee Mohammed Salim, in his fifties, from Al Nairab camp. Mohammed was arrested from his house 4 days ago and he was arrested several times before this time. It is mentioned that Al Nairab camp is considered as a strategic area for the both conflict parties in Syria because it is close from Al Nairab Military Airport. Al Nairab camp is fully controlled by the Syrian Regular Army.

In Libya, the Palestinian activists reported news via the social media website Facebook about that the Libyan Authorities intended to release a number of Palestinians of Syria and Syrian refugees, which they were arrested on 15-12-2014 while they were going from Ajdabiya to Tripoli in charges of illegal immigration. The activists reported that the Libyan authorities will transfer 17 Palestinians of Syria and Lebanon from Misrata prison to Tripoli prison to release them during the coming days, the AGPS was unable to make sure of the news from an official source.

Numbers and Statistics till 12/2/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- 2645 Palestinian refugee victims were documented by the AGPS.

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 586 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 666 days, water was cut for 157 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 165 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan,51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 488 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 457 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 659 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 303 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL SaiedaZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
