
"New Violation... ISIS executes a Palestinian refugee in Yarmouk camp"

- Member of Liwaa Al-Quds dies from a gunshot in Aleppo
- ISIS calls on the civilians in Yarmouk camp to prepare a "medical bag" for emergencies
- The Palestinian emergency committee in south Damascus warns of a catastrophic fate of civilians, if Yarmouk camp is bombarded
- 150 Palestinian and Syrian refugees call on the Greek authorities on the island of Chios, to take on their responsibilities towards them



Victims

Palestinian refugee, "Karram Fahd Abbas," member of the pro-regime Liwaa Al-Quds brigade, and resident of Handarat camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo, has died of a gunshot wound in the Zahraa Foundation in Aleppo.





Palestinian engineer, "Mohammed Said" from Neirab camp in Aleppo. He was known for his association with the Air Intelligence to facilitate his work in the construction of real estate with brokers. According to unofficial reports, it is estimated to consist of 3500 members. The Liwaa Al-Quds battalion includes members from the Neirab, Handarat and Raml camps, as well as fighters from the city of Aleppo and its western and northern suburbs, as well as the Shabah Aswad and Qomsan Soud battalions. The number of Palestinian fighters in it are estimated to be less than 500.

Latest Developments

ISIS in south Damascus published photos of its execution of Palestinian refugee, "Emad Al-Oraby," who is father to a three-year-old child, and resident of Street 15 in Yarmouk camp. According to ISIS, the execution came as a punishment for "self-deification of God."



Our correspondent in the camp could not confirm the accuracy of the information published by "ISIS" from other sources.



ISIS in Yarmouk camp had executed a number of Palestinian refugees under different pretexts, including spying with the armed Syrian opposition.

Also in south Damascus, ISIS's so called "Medical Office" issued a publication called a medical bag," calling on the residents of Yarmouk camp to prepare for emergencies.

According to the publication that was distributed in Yarmouk camp, the medical bag consists of the most important tools needed for emergency cases, including medicine, medical and emergency tools, food and children and infant necessities.

On their part, the residents of Yarmouk camp confirmed that ISIS does not provide them with any of those materials and has not opened medical points for their treatment. At the same time, the Syrian regime continues to tighten its siege on Yarmouk camp, preventing the return of the people or the entry of medical and ambulatory materials.



In the same context, the Palestinian emergency committee in south Damascus warned of a catastrophic fate of civilians, if Yarmouk camp is bombarded, as a result of the military escalation between the regime and ISIS.

According to our correspondent, members of the Committee discussed during a meeting held yesterday, the committee's accomplishments through the internal communication, and the attempt to open channels of communication with foreign policy holders and to direct letters to the Palestine Liberation Organization, to take on its responsibility towards the residents of Yarmouk camp, and try try securing a safe corridor for the people, in case all sides of the conflict decide to perform a military operation on the camp.

The committee was formed of Palestinian figures and representatives of the Palestinian organizations and bodies, to follow up on the latest developments regarding the Palestinian refugees in Yarmouk camp and the neighboring towns of south Damascus; Yelda, Babilla and Beit Sahm.

In Greece, the Action Group received calls sent by the Palestinian refugees on the Greek island of Chios, where they demanded that the Greek authorities provide their basic living necessities, in order to guarantee their personal dignities.

According to the refugees, about 150 Palestinian and Syrian refugees were distributed to one of the shelters, that lacked rooms or private areas for the women, girls and families, raising anger among the refugees and pushing them to organize a sit in on one of the nearby



roads, as well as cutting the transportation routes in order to grab attention to their suffering.

The refugees also called on all the rights and relief institutions concerned with the refugees, to work urgently towards putting an end to their suffering, in addition to protecting their rights and dignity.



Palestinians of Syria: April 13, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3694, including 467 women
- 1674 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,729 days in a row
- 206 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1464 days,
 and 1313 days in Yarmouk Camp



- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 561 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016, while 31 thousand refugees are estimated to be in Lebanon, 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan, 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt, 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey, and one thousand Palestinian-Syrians are in Gaza.
