Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Palestinian female students achieve first place at the Syrian level in the basic education exam"

Latest Developments

Despite all the difficulties facing Syria in general, and the Palestinian-Syrians in particular, the lack of material resources and the economic, living and psychological pressures, a number of female Palestinian students have achieved first place in the ninth basic education level, across the Syrian cities and provinces.

Students "Aya Abbas" from Yarmouk camp and "Farah Mohammed Abd El-Halim" from the Damr community for Palestinian refugees, ranked first in the Arab Republic of Syria, in the ninth basic education level for 2018. The results were issued by the Syrian Ministry of Education on the 13th of June where they both scored a total of 3100 out of 3100 marks.



Student "Bayan Ehsan Al-Dames" from Sabinah camp, succeeded in exceeding the basic education certificate in Syria with a total of 3010 out of 3100.

In recent years, many Palestinian refugees in Syria have emerged through their successes in the fields of learning and education. The



Palestinian student, "Zahr Yasser Al-Qusi," received the second rank across Syria and first place in the province of Damascus, in the high school educational exams for 2017. Student "Ghadeer Ahmed Al-Tuba," achieved first place in the province of Homs in the literary branch with a total of 2441 marks. In addition, student "Sherouk Ahmed Hamid," from Al-Aedin camp came first place in the camp and Al-Amal High School, in the scientific branch, with a total score of 2850 marks.

While Palestinian student "Nada Adnan Mobdy," came first place across Syria in the first stage of the high school exams and in the city of Quintera.

Meanwhile, student "Zein El-Abdin Khaled Sherif" from Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus, achieved first place in the industrial high school examinations for the year 2017, in the mechatronics department across Syria.

In a similar context, Palestinian refugee "Agheed Ahmed Falaha," achieved first place across the Arab Republic of Syria, in memorizing the Holy Quran.





On their part, the pioneers of the digital community discussed the success of Falaha and interacted with it, considering his achievement a new step that proves to the world how Palestinians in general and the Palestinian-Syrians in particular, can rise from under the rubble to rebuild their future with their hands, despite the conditions and tribulations they are facing.

Many Palestinian refugees have recently emerged through their successes in the areas of learning and education in Syria and several European countries.

In another context, four years after her arrest, Syrian security released Palestinian refugee "Yasmine Al-Laheeby," resident of the town of Muzayrib in the city of Deraa, south of Syria.

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria documented the arrest of 1679 Palestinian refugees in the Syrian regime's prisons, of which 106 are women.

In the same context, Syrian security released Palestinian refugee "Tareq Masbes" after a year of detention. Masbes was displaced from Neirab camp to Al-Aedin camp in Hama, since the beginning of the events that broke out in Aleppo.





Local Work Committees

The Charitable Association for Palestinian Relief concluded its "Eid Cover" Campaign, which included most of the children sponsored by the Association from a number of Palestinian camps in Syria.

According to the Association, the campaign was based on the enhancement of psychological aspects and selection by giving the child space to choose his own clothes and in accordance with his personality.

Most of the Palestinian families in Syria suffer from extremely poor living and economic conditions because of the widespread unemployment caused by the war.
