"The Syrian Armed Opposition Arrests Two Members of the PLA in the Eastern Ghouta"

Recent Updates

Al Islam Army, affiliated with the Syrian opposition, managed to arrest two PLA members; they are: Sergeant "Mofeed Majid Kaddoura," who was announced to be dead earlier, but later it turned out that he was captured by Al Islam Army, and Sergeant "Ahmed Sabry Shaaban." According to Al Islam Army, the two Sergeants were arrested during the ongoing battles of Madaa front in the eastern Ghouta.

PLA brigades are fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces on more than one front, young Palestinians in Syria, who are above 18 years, are forced to perform mandatory Liberation Army service, or he will be required for the security of Syria, which has forced hundreds of young Palestinian to migrate from Syria for refusing to fight alongside the Syrian regime forces.



Hundreds of residents of Hittin compound in Barza area are complaining of harsh humanitarian crises and conditions due to the reflection of the manifestations of the ongoing war in Syria on their living conditions. The compound remained neutral despite its proximity geographically from the

heart of events. The residents managed to avoid engaging the ongoing events in Syria, despite some people attempted to form popular committees for security, but residents refused to do so strongly and denied arming anyone.

With the beginning of 2013, it has become more serious, where the compound was subjected to shelling as well as sniping that was aimed at everything that moves. The compound was not a target in itself but as a result of its location in contact on the main road area and next to service complex (which is the leadership location of the regular army and air security north of Damascus) and communicates directly with the proregime Al Bayader neighborhood which is full of gunmen from the popular Committees.

It is overseen by the western side with Talet Al Bohouth Al Almeia which is full of guns and machine guns against the neighborhood as well as Ish Alwerwar Mount from the north.



The compound is bordered from the east directly with Barza Al Balad lanes, which was controlled by the Free Army groups. All mentioned

above contributed making the compound as a confrontation line between the two sides.

Events culminated in the beginning of March 2013 until residence became a threat to the population as a result of the large number of shells and sniping operations as well as the blockade, in addition to calls for evacuation by both parties.

People began to be displaced gradually till the compound became completely empty by mid-April 2013, but its residents were able to return to it later, after signing a truce between the regular army and the Syrian armed opposition groups in Barza Al Balad area.

Educational process at Al Aedein camp declined sharply due to many reasons, such as the immigration of professional teachers due to the deteriorated security conditions, in addition to the search of safety and security after the increasing base of arrest and blackmailing by names, nationalities, and religious, in addition to the psychological pressure on those who did not engage and align to a specific party, forcing them to flee, although the privileges they had enjoyed such as the high salaries paid to them by UNRWA.

Accordingly, this gap in the educational process was filled by teachers who do not have the necessary competence to carry out the educational process; such as appointing new graduates of university students without subjecting them to the qualifying sessions for the preparation of teachers and mastery of teaching aids and methods, classroom management, and modern techniques of education. Students were forced to attend private institutes, which increases the financial burden on their parents.

In addition, schools were merged and a school was closed due to displacement, migration, and dropout. The number of students in some classes does not exceed 17 students, especially the ninth grade.

The AGPS documentation and monitoring team announced that 13 % of Palestinian victims, who died during last June, are children. The AGPS noted that 36 Palestinian refugees died due to the ongoing conflict in Syria last month, including 5 children, one of them died due to torture in the Syrian prisons.

The AGPS monitoring team pointed out that victims among children are: "Mahmoud Abdullah Yusuf Eid Diab," who died due to in the prisons of the Syrian regime after being detained for about three years. He was arrested when he was 13 years old, he is from Al Aedein camp in Hama, and originally from Al Shajara village in Palestine.

The 10-year-child, "Nariman Essam Rustam," died after their vehicle they were traveling in was shot by unknown sources in the town of Sheikh Saad, north of Deraa, where they were visiting their relatives. They are displaced from the city of Daraa to Muzeireeb area in Deraa suburb.

The child, "Younis Awadallah Al Najjar," who died due to wounds he attained by the explosions of Al Sayeda Zainab area in Damascus suburb on Saturday, 06/11/2016, and the 5-year-child Suhaib Izz al-Din Yusuf, who died due to the shelling that targeted Khan Al Shieh campon 29/06/2016.

On the other hand, the Palestinian Syrian young woman, Maya Sameer Al Asadi, a former resident of Al Aedein camp in Homs, obtained full marks at the high school exams in Sweden. Maya enrolled in the College of human medicine at the University of "Gothenburg."

Meanwhile, the young woman, "Farah Firas Shakir," a former resident of Yarmouk in Damascus suburb, managed to attend the University of Malmo in southern Sweden after she achieved full marks of the high school exams in Sweden.

It is noteworthy that the two refugees managed to excel in high school exams in spite of the many difficulties that they faced, especially with regard to the new language, different teaching methods, and curricula in Sweden from what it was in Syria.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 13\07\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey

- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1121 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1183 days, water was cut for 672 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 975 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 167 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 828 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
