Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee Abdullah Mohamed Gazi was tortured to death in Syrian government prisons, AGPS found out.

The casualty, aged 20, was kidnapped by the government troops on December, 14, 2013 on his way out of Yarmouk camp to fetch bread loafs.



AGPS identified him through a set of photographs showing torture victims in war-torn Syria.

AGPS documented the death of 469 Palestinian refugees under torture in Syrian lock-ups, where 1,627 Palestinians have been enduring mysterious fates.

In another development, the Syrian regime forces allowed the sick Palestinian refugee Iyad Abu Hamdan, to safely exit southern Damascus so as to undergo urgent medical checks and therapy at Jaffa Hospital, in Damascus.

The medical referral was carried out via a Red Crescent vehicle, in a move that was reportedly brokered by the Palestine Liberation Organization.

Over recent weeks, Hamdan's health status has sharply deteriorated as his appeals for urgent medical referral to Damascus hospitals have gone unheeded by the Syrian government.

40-year-old Hamdan, diagnosed with clogged foot artilleries, said medics asked him to show up in the hospital every five days for urgent medical checks following a surgery he had undergone sometime earlier.



Meanwhile, residents of AlNeirab Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Aleppo, have sounded distress signals over the acute dearth in bread, which they attributed to the attempts of anonymous parties to shorn civilians of much-needed items.

Hundreds of civilians continue to line up on a quasi-daily basis in long queues outside local ovens in the hunt for a bundle of bread loafs to feed their starved children and families.

AlNeirab residents have spoken out against the poor selling mechanisms and the abrupt closure of distribution centers along with the influx of residents of nearby towns, including AlNeirab, Tel Shu'ayeb, and Jibreen, to the camp in the hunt for bread. The residents also warned that bakers have been selling large quantities of flour to unidentified parties.

Civilians urged the Syrian government, among all other concerned parties, to urgently work on securing bread, increasing flour supplies to local bakeries, holding crooked bakers to account, controlling bread sales in Jibreen and AlNeirab, and restoring local distribution centers.

In the meantime, Palestinian brothers Mohamed Ali Badawi, 27, and Mootaz Ali Badawi, 40, have been held in Syria government jails for over three years.

Both were arrested in AlHajar AlAswad area, near Yarmouk Camp. Their family continues to appeal for information.

Palestinians of Syria: August 13, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,556 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,626 Palestinian refugees, including 103 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,479 days in a row.

- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,218 and 1,067 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,561 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 314 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
