Victims

The Palestinian "Muhammed Abd AlNasser Nasr", resident of Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees, was found dead yesterday in Germany, with signs of being stabbed using a knife over his body. No information has been released about the incident so far, while the German police have not made any statements about the case.



Latest Developments

AGPS's correspondent has confirmed that the past few days have witnessed great dissent in ISIS's ranks, which is in control of major areas in Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus.

According to our reporter, the camp witnessed the return of Al-Ansar groups that are stationed in and around Street 15 and are known to have split from Al-Nusra Front and leaving ISIS.

This comes amid many reports that ISIS is coming to an agreement with the Syrian government to withdraw its members from Yarmouk to Al-Hajar Al-Aswad neighborhood, which will lead the regime forces to enter and take control of the camp.





Armed Syrian opposition factions in the towns of south Damascus (Yelda, Beit Sahm, Babilla and Al-Kadam), published on Wednesday, a press release confirming its refusal of any decisions to forcibly displace residents of the towns of southern Damascus.

Jaish Al-Ababeel," Ahrar AlSham faction, Sham Al-Rasool, "Jaish Al-Islam," "Ferqat Damashq" and "Aknaf Bait al-Maqdis" all signed the press release.

On their side, residents of south Damascus organized a demonstration on Wednesday, roaming the streets of Yelda, Beit Sahm, Babilla towns; to express their refusal for forced displacement and demographic change.

Participants in the demonstration held a number of speeches stressing on the attachment of the residents to their towns and not leaving them. They also raised banners to express their rejection of the demographic change project that is based on a sectarian basis and serves the Syrian regime and the sectarian militias affiliated to it.



The demonstration in south Damascus comes amid news that spread across global media yesterday, confirming a deal between the regional states that demands handing liberated south Damascus over to the Syrian government. Those who refuse the agreement will be displaced to the North, in exchange for the evacuation of the people of Kafria and AlFoua from the Idlib countryside, ahead of the upcoming military campaign.



In another context, UNRWA's presidency in Damascus has demanded that the Palestinian teachers who left Syria and went to Lebanon fearing their lives after the outbreak of war in Syria, to return. It allowed them until the end of the year to enroll in Syrian schools, giving them the choices of returning to Syria, working without payment or resigning.

The teachers, especially the youth, refused the decision which could lead to their arrest by the Syrian regime forces. They demanded the UNRWA to retract the decision for now, with hope that the security situation in Syria may stabilize and allow for their return to the camps and homes they left fearing their families' lives. On the other



hand, legally protecting them from abuse or detention was also among the demands.
