Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Member of "Fath Al-Intefada" dies in clashes and "Free Palestine Movement" sends its members to support the regime in it"

- Communications network cut out from Khan Al-Sheih camp for fifth consecutive day
- Palestinian-Syrian elected President of Palestinian Doctors Gathering in Sweden
- Human Rights Committee in European Parliament accuses German authorities of obstructing the reunion of refugee families



Latest Developments:

Palestinian "Ahmed Faisal Al-Omr" a member of the "Fath Al-Intefada" movement, affiliated to the Syrian regime, has died while fighting alongside the regime forces in the ongoing clashes in Deir ez-Zour, east of Syria.

On its part, AGPS's statistics revealed that 624 Palestinian refugees died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces.



In the same context, the Free Palestine Movement, one of the Palestinian military groups that is affiliated to the Syrian regime, announced on its Facebook page that it sent a number of its members to fight alongside the Syrian regime in the Deir ez-Zour suburbs, north of Syria, noting that the members it sent used to fight in Yarmouk camp.

A number of Palestinian factions in several Syrian cities recruit the Palestinian youth in the Palestinian camps and their gatherings, to fight alongside the Syrian regime forces against the armed Syrian opposition groups and sending groups them away from their camps,



particularly in the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - the general command aside Fath Movement - Al-Intefada, Al-Saaeqa, the Free Palestine Movement, Al-Owda battalion and the Palestinian Popular Struggle Front.

In the meantime, residents of Khan Al-Sheih camp for Palestinian refugees in the west of the suburbs of Damascus, are complaining of the cutting of the communications network for the fifth consecutive day.



They are also suffering from tough humanitarian crises, as a result of the unofficial siege imposed on the camp by the Syrian regime, where the regime prevents its residents from entering or leaving it without a security approval. The residents are also suffering from the widespread of unemployment and the lack of field source to buy from.

The residents of Khan Al-Sheih camp are also living in a state of fear and tension due to the ongoing raids and arrests that have affected many of them, despite an agreement between the regime and the



armed Syrian opposition to avoid the residents and lift the tight siege that is imposed on the camp.

In another context, the Palestinian Doctors Gathering in Sweden elected the Palestinian-Syrian doctor "Moaamar Mawed" from Yarmouk camp, as their President. This came during the yearly conference held by the Gathering in Sweden, on Saturday 11-11-2017, including doctors from all over the Swedish Kingdom.



During the conference, the financial and managerial reports provided by the administrative board, were discussed and approved. The participants also mentioned the vision and goals of the Gathering, which was established in 2008, with the aim of uiting the experiences of the Palestinian doctors living in Europe and using their experiences to help the Palestinian people inside and abroad, on the medical level.

In another context, the Human Rights Committee in the European Parliament criticized the German policy followed regarding the reuniting of the refugee families. Barbara Lochbeller,



Deputy Head of the Human Rights Committee in the European Parliament, said that the German authorities are obstructing the reunions of the refugee families.

The criticism comes while thousands of refugees are waiting to be reunited with their families in Germany, especially in Greece. They have protested several times in front of the German embassy in Athens to demand the rapid finishing of their immigration procedures.

Lochbeller also criticized most of the EU countries for the prevention, without fairly distributing the refugees across the participating countries. The Greek leftist newspaper Avimrida Ton Cintacton previously revealed a Greek-German agreement to slow down the process of reuniting the refugee families that were separated in both countries while trying to find a safe shelter.

Hundreds of Palestinian and Syrian refugees in Greece are facing a severe suffering and extended periods of waiting for a decision regarding their case. Dozens of them are waiting to be reunited with their families in Germany.

Palestinians of Syria: November 13, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3609, including 463 women
- 1640 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women

- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,580 days in a row
- 203 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1317 days,
 and 1157 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,653 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 416 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
