Latest Developments

The Palestine Charity
Commission distributed muchneeded items to the Palestinian
refugee families displaced from
Khan Al-Sheih Camp to Idlib.

Rental allowances and food parcels were handed out to some 250 displaced Palestinian families.



In another development, government troops deployed at military checkpoints have been banning the access of Al-Sbeina residents to their homes for 1,127 days running.

Hundreds of refugees taking shelter in the government-led Al-Sbeina Camp were forced out of their homes due to the unabated hostilities between the regime army and the opposition battalions. High unemployment rates and dire living conditions have made the area uninhabitable.

According to eye-witnesses, over 80% of civilian homes and structures in the camp have been reduced to rubble, particularly in the area stretching from Muadh Ibn Jabal Mosque and Furn Al-Akrad, at the western entrance to the camp.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee Hamza Al-Laham, a resident of the Homs-based Al-Aydeen Camp, was released from Syrian prisons, where he had been locked up for over a couple of weeks.



1,135 Palestinian refugees are incarcerated in Syrian jails, 186 among whom identified as residents of Al-Aydeen Camp whose fates have remained unknown.

At the same time, UNRWA on Tuesday transferred cash winter assistance via ATM cards to the Palestinian refugees displaced from Syria to Lebanon.

The sum included 100\$ for rental fees and 27\$ as a food allowance.

UNRWA further provided those living in areas higher than 500 meters above sea level with \$588, covering the four installments pledged by the agency. Those sheltered in areas lower than 500 meters above sea level received \$400.

Civil Action Committees

The Palestine Charity Commission handed out winter allowances for heating equipment and firewood to the needy Palestinian families displaced to Damascus' southern towns of Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem.

The commission's staff members installed heaters for a number of Palestinian refugee families.

The campaign targeted orphans, elderly refugees, patients, wounded civilians, widows, and poor families.

The Furqan Charity also distributed food parcels to the Palestinians of Syria taking refuge in Ein Al-Hilweh Camp, in the southern Lebanese city of Sidon.

The move makes part of an annual project to provide the displaced Palestinian families with frozen meat so as to assuage the tragic fallouts of the socio-economic crisis rocking Ein Al-Hilweh Camp.

Along the same line, the Turkish Khayra Ummah Organization distributed 100 food packages, provided by the International Humanitarian Relief Foundation (IHH), to the Palestinian-Syrian families housed in the Turkish city of Kilis.

A couple of days ago, winter clothes and toddler milk provided by the Turkish Al-Yad Organization were distributed by the Khayra Ummah charity to the Palestinians of Syria sheltered in the area.

Palestinians of Syria: December 13, 2016 Statistics:

- There are 17,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan as of the end of September 2016, according to UNRWA figures.
- 31,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are housed in Lebanon.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,274 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,333 days and 794 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 191.

- Sbeina refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,127 days running.
- Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,319 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.
- Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 977 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.
- Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.
