Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"10 Palestinian-Syrians died in November 2017, and 15 victims died in the same month in 2016"

- Violent clashes in Yarmouk camp and its neighborhoods bombarded with "elephant" rockets
- A 6-month-old infant injured amid the regime forces' bombardment of Yarmouk camp
- UNRWA in Lebanon announces its money and winter aids to support the Palestinian refugees coming from Syria



Latest Developments

AGPS's Monitoring and Documentation Team announced that it recorded the deaths of about 10 Palestinians during November 2017, while 15 refugees died in the same month of 2016. The deaths resulted from the ongoing conflict in Syria. The Action Group noted that the victims of November 2017 were distributed across the areas in Syria as follows: 4 refugees died in Damascus, 3 in Deir ez-Zour, 2 people died in the suburbs of Damascus and another person's place of death is unknown.

The Action Group also pointed out that the Palestinian refugees who died in November 2016, were distributed as follows: 4 refugees died in the suburbs of Damascus, 4 others in Homs, in addition to 7 people who died in different places.



In the south of Damascus, Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees, was bombarded by "elephant" rockets, yesterday, targeting Palestinian Road and Al-Tadamon neighborhood. This was in conjunction with violent clashes which took place between the Palestinian factions affiliated to the regime, and members of ISIS,



after ISIS launched a surprise attack on the regime forces' checkpoint in the Nisreen neighborhood, and controlled a number of blocks of buildings in the neighborhood.

In the same context, the day before yesterday, Yarmouk camp was bombarded with a high-explosive missile, which targeted the avenues of Deir Yassin in the camp, causing material damage only.

In the meantime, an infant was injured on Wednesday, due to the rocket and artillery bombardment by the Syrian regime forces on different areas of Yarmouk camp, in the south of the capital Damascus.

The Action Group's correspondent clarified that the 6-month-old child "Adnan Awad Moussa," sustained injuries following the bombarding of Yarmouk camp using mortar shells. The boy was taken to the field hospital in the town of Yelda, however our reporter noted that the child needs to be taken to one of Damascus' hospitals for treatment and to undergo a surgery.





For their part, a number of activists and dignitaries of Yelda have launched an appeal, to mediate with the regime in order to allow the child to leave and save his life.

In Lebanon, UNRWA announced that it will provide cash assistance for the Winter, to the Palestinian refugees families coming from Syria, to help them cope with the harsh winter cold. This assistance is added to UNRWA's emergency cash assistance, which covers the food assistance of \$25 and the \$100 residence allowance for the families.

UNRWA clarified that it will provide the winter cash assistance, along with the monthly financial aid, through UNRWA's ATM cards in a single payment covering the three months as follows: 75 American dollars per month, for three months for each family living in the Beqaa, since it is the coldest. 75 American dollars will be given per month, for one month, to each family living in the other areas of Lebanon. The sum will be available on the cards on the 13th of December 2017.

Palestinians of Syria: December 13, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3616, including 463 women
- 1644 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,610 days in a row



- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1347 days,
 and 1187 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,683 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 446 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
