#### Khan Al Shieh Camp

Explosive barrels targeted Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb at dawn today, where one of them fell on the eastern neighborhood of the camp, which led to a large number of injuries, at least one victim, and damage to buildings and property,



It is worth mentioning that the camp and its surroundings are being subjected to frequent shelling, which intensified in the past few days, coinciding with the continuation of the regular army to close all roads linking the camp and the center of the capital, Damascus, except for "Zakya - Khan Al Shieh.".

#### **Victims**

The PFGC member, Mr. Mahmoud Fantazeih, died during clashes that broke out before yesterday at Al Thalathein Street and the Yarmouk Court vicinity between the Regular Army alongside the Palestinian groups and ISIS groups.

### Recent Updates

Residents of Deraa camp south of Syria complain from the absence of any hospital or medical center, and from a severe lack of medicines, first aid materials, and medical equipment.

In addition, ambulances that transport the injuries to receive medical treatment outside the camp are not available, where the Syrian regular army snipers impede the arrival of ambulances to the camp. In case residents managed to transfer one of the patients outside the camp trying to treat him in Jordan, the latter refuse the entry of any Palestinian refugees from Syria even injuries.



Accordingly, some of them were forced to enter Jordan as a Syrian citizen for treatment, moreover, a number of activists inside the camp warned of the spread of diseases among residents in light of having to use contaminated drinking water, due to the cut of drinking water for around 423days.

The repeated shelling and clashes taking place in Deraa camp since the beginning of the ongoing war, according to unofficial statistics, caused the destruction of about 70% of its buildings.

The remaining refugees live in very serious humanitarian situations, as the suffering was not limited to the health side, but exceeded the standard of living, as power outages for long periods of up to several days has doubled their suffering.


In addition to the non-availability of fuels and heating materials, the loss of many varieties of food, the high prices of other materials dramatically, making hundreds of Palestinian families to leave the camp and go to the neighboring towns.

In the same context, the suffering of Palestinian refugees who fled from Handarat camp 780 days ago is still continue, where they were displaced from their homes after the Syrian armed opposition controlled the camp.

residents of the camp facing difficult living conditions caused by the case of displacement, the continuing war in Syria, and the implications on the economic situation, which in turn led to the weakness of financial resources and the spread of unemployment.

The AGPS has documented the names of 59 victims from Handarat camp, as well as 32 detainees in Syrian prisons.

However, Hndarat camp and adjacent areas are still subjected to bombed and violent clashes between the Syrian armed opposition groups and the regular army alongside a group of al-Quds Brigade, where the regular army is trying to impose its control over the camp, which is a strategic

point for him, while opposition groups seek to advance towards the town of Handarat and the central prison of Aleppo.

In Homs, Syrian security forces released three residents of Al Aedein camp; they are: "Marwan Ali Ghareb," after being detained for more than a year in the central prison in Homs, "Amer Talib Darwish," in his forties, originally from Al Shajara village in Palestine, and "Mustafa Al Rouba," who was arrested for more than three months, in his thirties, and originally Safed city in Palestine.

#### Civil Work Committees

In the presence of a group of displaced Palestinian refugees from their camps to the town of Qudsaya-Damascus suburb, Jafra Foundation carried out a theatrical concert and exhibition for children.

The foundation also implemented an exhibition of graphic works and handicrafts, recycling and origami in Qudsaya, while Jafra continues psychological and social support sessions for children in Qudsaya, Jaramana, and Al Aedein camp in Homs, trying to alleviate the psychological effects of war on children.

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Turkey - Istanbul continues to visit displaced Palestinian families from Syria, and provide them with financial assistance after seeing their suffering, where more than a family live in a single and simple home, and in most homes more than three families live in one house, which is poorly furnished, while some families living in a dire conditions as a result of lack of financial resources and the difficulty of finding a job.

#### Numbers and Statistics till 13/6/2015

- 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 35,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.

- The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 888 detainees, and 398 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 716 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 786 days, water was cut for 276 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 597 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 578 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 780 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 423 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
