14 Palestinian Refugees Died in Syria Since the Beginning of this Month.

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Recent Updates

The Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in the south of the Syrian capital, Damascus, witnessed the fall of a number of mortar shells into separated areas without causing any casualties among civilians. The Yarmouk camp is still witnessing a state of security tension on all its combating axes as a result of the exchange of shelling and clashes between ISIS and Al-Nusra Front on one hand and the Regular Army and the Palestinian factions loyal to it on the other hand. As well as, between state regulation and groups of the Syrian armed opposition in Yalda area adjacent to the camp and the resulting closure of the only road between the camp and Yalda due to that tension.

During that, thousands of Palestinian children in Syria were not allowed to pursue their studies in their camps this year. This was due to the bombings, clashes, and siege which led to the stoppage of study completely including Al-Sabeenah camp in Damascus Suburb due to the prevention of the regime forces the return of residents to their homes



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after being displaced because of the violent clashes ended up with the control of the regular army on the camp completely.

The same situation can be seen in Handarat in Aleppo. The residents of the camp were migrated from it after the control of the Syrian opposition groups over the camp while most of the Yarmouk camp students became homeless except (3000) thousands of refugees stayed in it and suffered from the ravages of the system siege, the Popular Front - General Command, and invasion of the ISIS and its control over the camp.

As well as, Daraa camp students are suffering from great difficulty in starting their academic year especially after the shelling of about 70% of the buildings of the camp as well as to the compounding of Muzeireeb in which the aircrafts targeted a number of UNRWA buildings inside it.

On the other hand, yesterday witnessed the start of the new academic year for the students of the first phase of study in some camp including Al- Aadeen camp in Homs and Hama; Al- Ramel in Latakia; Al- Neirab in Aleppo; and Khan Al- Sheeh, Khan Dannon, Jaramana, Sayeda Zeinab and Husseiniya in the suburb of Damascus.

The academic year started with a harsh economic and living conditions that forced parents and school officials to give up many of the requirements of school including books, stationery, and school clothes due to the inability of most people to provide those requirements because of unemployment, the high cost of living, and the high rents of houses especially for the displaced.

Greece

Greek Coast Guard announced that 28 people drowned off the coast of Greece due to the sinking of the boat that was carrying about 100 illegal immigrants.

The boat sank off the coast of Faramcconnes Island which lies15 kilometers from Turkey. The Coast Guard was able to rescue 68 passengers while 29 survived who swam up to the island beach in southeastern Aegean Sea.

It is noteworthy that thousands of Palestinian refugees escaped from the war in Syria to European countries looking for a peaceful life.

A large part of them are still being held in a number of European countries such as Greece, Hungary, Italy, Serbia, and Macedonia because of the large audit of immigrants in those countries. Immigrants there are living difficult humanitarian conditions including being imprisoned and forced to put their mark as well as the denial of their



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right in an application for asylum in European countries and to live with their families there.

Malaysia

The Palestinian activist, Ibrahim Abu Kharaj, from the residents of the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugee in Damascus, renewed his appeal to what he described as the owners of the resolution of the Palestine Liberation Organization and human rights organizations the United Nations to work on his release from Kuala Lumpur airport prison after being held about five days ago.

Abu Kharaj stressed in his appeal the need to find a quick solution to his problem before being deported to Syria due to the threat of that to his life.



Lebanon

A number of Syrian- Palestinian students in Lebanon complained on the decision Siblin Institute administration of vocational and technical



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training of the Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees UNRWA in Lebanon to not accept most of the students applying to the Institute. In addition, they appealed to all concerned parties, the embassy, and the Palestinian factions to pressure on the administration of Siblin Institute to accept them in the Institute similar to their counterparts of the residents of the Palestinian refugees residing in Lebanon.

In details that students who have obtained a certificate of secondary education in the last year could not get the baccalaureate testimony which depriving them from attending the university. As a result, they moved toward Siblin Institute of UNRWA to register in it but the administration of the Institute accepted one student of Palestinians of Syria in each branch under the pretext of the priority of the Palestinian Lebanese student and left others on the waiting list.



According to the complainants that their grades are high and qualify them for admission in the Institute, Therefore, the students called for the UNRWA administration to direct its educational institutions and others



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towards the equality among the Palestinian refugees whether residents or refugees from Syria in the consideration that it is the only International Foundation sponsors for the Palestinian refugees without distinction between asylum countries in which it operates.


It is worth mentioning that the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon are suffering from many legal and living problems which begin with the accommodation procedures which do not end with high cost of living and the lack of job opportunities.

Statistics

The AGPS Monitoring and Documentation team reported that 14 Palestinian refugees victims died in Syria since the beginning of September 2015, including five members of PLA and three refugees due to sniping, a victim died due to torture in the Syrian prisons, a refugee died due to clashes in Ein Al Helwa camp, A female refugee died due to serious coronary disease while she was travelling to get treatment from Syria to Turkey, two refugees died due to siege and lack of medical aid, and a girl died in Turkey due to an electric shock. It is worthy to mention that 50 Palestinian refugees died during August 2015.

Numbers and Statistics till 13/9/2015

• 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.



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- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 803 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 873 days, water was cut for 363 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 665 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 866 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 510 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
