One Palestinian has reportedly been killed during the fighting in Shiek-Meskeen town in Dara'a south Syria. "Amer Abdalla Abu Soud", from Mozereeb, was announced dead after he had been shot by the pro-Assad forces in the area. It is mentioned that Abu Soud is descendent to Almawasa tribe, the one of the tribes of north Palestine.


RECENT UPDATES

Activists and relatives of several Palestinian soldiers complained about the leadership of PLR refuses demobilising conscripts at the end of their military service period. Letters received by AGPS during the last few months assured that some soldiers have been serving since the beginning of the Syrian war in 2011. It is indicated that most of Palestinian refugees in Syria have to spend, at least, 2 years in compulsory military service. The service should be under the leadership of Palestine Liberation Army (PLA), which is fully subjected to the instructions of Syrian Ministry of Defence.

At end of the military service, one soldier completed all his requirements, but the top leader of PLA, Brigadier General "Tariq Alkhadra", refused to sign the application of demobilisation, which means keeping him in service for unknown time, the soldier, under condition of anonymity, told AGPS.

Many activists accused that PLA sided with Assad regime in the fighting against the opposition deploying Palestinian soldiers in the hotspots fighting.

AGPS has documented 153 victims from PLA during the war in Syria since March 2011.

NGOs

In Turkey, a delegation of Scholars of Palestine Institution, The Turkish Assembly for solidarity with Palestine (Fidder) and Palestine Charity Associationhave discussed the situation of Palestinians-in-Turkey with the consultant of PM "Muhammed Murtaza Yetiş". The meeting, which was held in Istanbul last Wednesday, focused on the Palestinian refugees' rights in Turkey. The delegation provided a detailed report regarding the plight of Palestinians in general, asking the Turkish government to facilitate specific measures related to this issue. In his turn, Yetiş assured that Turkey has adopted a decision to equal the Palestinians inside Turkey as Syrian refugees.

According to AGPS, the number of Palestinians in Turkey estimated between 6000-8000 in Istanbul, mid and south of Turkey. It is mentioned

that Turkish embassies are still prevent visas to the Palestinians from Syria.



ARRESTING

Two brothers, "Ammar Jumaa Ebraheem" 34-years-old and his brother "Khaled" 40-year-old, are still in enforced disappearance since September 2013. The Syrian security had arrested the two brothers as they were checked at the security point in Shaineh camp road. It is indicated that Ammar and Khaled from Yarmook camp.

Since the beginning of the war, AGPS documented about 1030 Palestinian detainees in the Syrian prisons, including 75 females.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 14 January 2016

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 926 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 986 days, water cut for 486 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 187 victims.
- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 922 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 986 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 640 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.
