Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria

## **Victims**

Palestinian "Omar Taher Abu Darwish," born in 1985 and resident of Al-Hossaineyya camp, died on the 13th of May 2018, while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces in the ongoing clashes in south Damascus, against ISIS.



This brings the number of Palestinian military personnel who have died since the beginning of the military operation on 19/4/2018, on Yarmouk camp and Al-Hajar Al-Aswad, to 25 people.

## **Latest Developments**

"Zain Sham Ramy Al-Ayesh," a Palestinian girl, has died of her injuries, after the Syrian regime forces and the Palestinian factions affiliated to it bombarded the neighborhoods of Deraa camp, two days ago. She was wounded with her mother and they were taken to Nawa Hospital in the south of Syria.







On his part, the Action Group's correspondent reported that Deraa camp is violently bombarded on a daily basis, by the Syrian forces, with rocket-propelled grenades, causing destruction to 80% of its houses and neighborhoods.

He noted that the remaining residents of the camp are suffering from the lack of basic services and the shortage of relief assistance, as a result of the siege imposed on them by the regime's forces.

In the meantime, the warplanes intensified their air raids on Yarmouk camp and Al-Hajar Al-Aswad yesterday, causing more destruction to the area.

The Action Group's correspondent stated that the Syrian air force launched dozens of raids overnight on Yarmouk camp and Al-Hajar Al-Aswad. This coincided with the outbreak of violent clashes between the regime and the Palestinian factions affiliated to it, and ISIS, noting that the events taking place are a street war, especially in the vicinity of Al-Hajar Al-Aswad municipality south of Damascus.





On its part, media sources announced that the regime progressed in several fighting axes, where it imposed its control on a number of building blocks including, UNRWA's school, the Popular Labor Office in the south-west of Yarmouk camp, and the Center for Educational Development in the north of Al-Hajar Al-Aswad.

On its part, Liwaa Al-Quds mourned the death of 9 of its members on its social media pages, who died in an ambush set up by ISIS, on one of the combat hubs in Al-Hajar Al-Aswad neighborhood, and destroyed a number of military mechanisms, while the regime's forces made it clear that it caused many casualties among ISIS.

While ISIS confirmed that 40 members of the regime died and a BMP vehicles was destroyed during the ongoing fighting with the Syrian regime's forces, indicating that the number of members of the regime who died since the beginning of the military operation exceeded 800 people, and dozens of injuries.

The military operation, which the regime began on Yarmouk camp, Al-Hajar Al-Aswad and Al-Tadamon, has entered its 24th day and led to the destruction of 60% of Yarmouk camp. It has also led to the death of 19 civilians, some of which are still buried under the rubble, and the displacement of 90% of its residents to the towns neighboring to the camp.

In another context, a number of Palestinian refugees from Syria participated in a sit-in, in support of the Awda March, in the German city of Munich. They stressed during their participation,



their right to return to their land, their support of al-Aqsa and their rejection to the oppression happening to the Palestinian people.

It is noteworthy that the number of Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Europe exceeded 85 thousand refugees, while the Action Group noted that these numbers are unofficial.

## Palestinians of Syria: May 14, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3745, including 467 women
- 1676 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,760 days in a row
- 206 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1495 days, and 1344 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 591 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016, while 31 thousand refugees are estimated to be in Lebanon, 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan, 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt, 8



thousand refugees are staying in Turkey, and one thousand Palestinian-Syrians are in Gaza.
