"Syrian Warplanes Target Deraa Camp and Muzareeb Compound with Rockets and Explosive Barrels"

The PFGC Condolence, on its website, the Palestinian refugee Hussein Jalal from Jaramana Camp, who died due to wounds he attained following an Israeli shelling at one of its locations at Zabadani area in Damascus suburb.



Recent Updates

The Syrian warplanes targeted Muzareeb town, which is located 10 km southwest of Deraa camp south of Syria, and inhabited with about 8,500 Palestinian Refugees, with two explosive barrels causing massive destruction at buildings and properties.

Moreover, on August 10, the Syrian warplanes also targeted Muzareeb town with rockets and resulted in the death of 3 victims and a large number of injuries among civilians.





Meanwhile, the regular army continues to target Deraa camp and surrounding areas with rockets and explosive barrels, according to the AGPS correspondent that the camp was bombed with two explosive barrels resulted in victims and a number of wounded among civilians, while warplanes launched two raids yesterday morning and resulted in a large destruction in homes and property.

In Damascus Suburb, the suffering of about 6000 displaced Palestinian families from Yarmouk and other camps to Qudsia area continues due to the siege, which is imposed on the area by the Regular Army since 23rd of July 2015 because of the kidnap of one of its members by the military Opposition. The siege was negatively affected residents of the town and the displaced Palestinian refugees, where they suffer from bread and food materials shortage.

In a related context, some Facebook pages mentioned that there are negotiations going on between the Syrian Opposition and the Regular Army, which are expected to lead to a breakthrough, and may result to end the siege of Qudsia. The AGPS was not able to assure the news from other sources.

In the middle of Syria, members of the Regular Army checkpoint at Hama city arrested the two Palestinian brothers, Zeyd Emad Abu Baker and Mohammed Emad Abu Baker from Yarmouk camp after trying to resort to Turkey.



In Lebanon, the Displaced Palestinians refugees of Syria in Lebanon continues escalating their protests to put pressure on UNRWA in order to reconsider its decisions of cutting its financial aid and reduction of its services to the Palestinian refugees, in addition to their refusal to postpone the school year in UNRWA schools. The protestors also called UNRWA high Commissioner Pierre Krähenbühl to resign and leave if he insisted to postpone the school year and reduce UNRWA services.





Numbers and Statistics till 14/8/2015:-

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 774 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 843 days, water was cut for 333 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 654 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 635 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 836 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 480 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
